LETTERS

Dear PEZ Pals,

We met recently with Richard Geary to trade and make plans for the Third Collector's Convention. We incorporated all of your suggestions from last year and had a few new ideas of our own that are sure to make this year the best ever. We promise better organization, and more group function options. We are looking forward to seeing everyone in July, and since more people are becoming interested in collecting we hope to meet many new collectors.

Last July at the National Candy Wholesale Convention in Boston we had the chance to have a lengthy conversation with Scott McWhinnie, President and CEO of the PEZ Company. (No we will not be selling his business card.)

We focused on the relationship between the PEZ Company and collectors. We were still pumping enthusiasm from the energy generated from meeting other collectors last June in Mentor (Ohio). He was slightly bemused by the collecting phenomenon.

We advocated the PEZ collecting could be good for the PEZ Company and could generate good publicity for them. He believes that his main objective is to sell new PEZ, not to talk about the past. He also gave several examples where collectors have caused problems in the past.

Mr. McWhinnie is sure to see the benefits of becoming more supportive of collecting as the hobby grows and relationships are bound to improve if all collectors keep two things in mind. DON'T RIP OFF THE PEZ TRADEMARK OR PATENTS and DON'T EXPECT THE PEZ COMPANY TO BE AN ARCHIVE FOR HISTORICAL INFORMATION.

Our own understanding of trademarks is murky, so we would be thrilled if there are any attorneys that would like to follow up on these points. As far as we can tell PEZ is a registered trademark, and any time the word PEZ is used to describe the dispensers, candy or any consumer product, the word PEZ should be followed by the word brand or a register mark. Many articles and dealer lists neglect this legality.

In addition, many companies license their characters to PEZ, so if one of these characters is pictured on a commercial product without permission from PEZ, and without permission from the character licensee, then it is a Maalox moment for Mr. McWhinnie. This is why the puzzle was pulled off the market.

Face it, if PEZ did not vigorously protect their trademarks, then anyone could flood the market with inferior imitation and PEZ would lose its unique appeal. Because of this we are asking all collectors and dealers not to promote any bootleg dispensers or anything else that might be trademark infringement. We believe that it is not necessary to use the word brand or the register mark when referring to the company, only with the products.

Mr. McWhinnie made it very clear that the company does not have the personnel or the records to act as a resource for collectors. Nor do they want to because he feels it would take time away from selling new PEZ. Please don't bother contacting them for information. If you want to see more PEZ than you could ever imagine, then come to the Third Convention in Willoughby (Ohio). (It's just down the road from Mentor (Ohio) in the Cleveland suburbs.) A weekend of show and tell with the top collectors and dealers from around the country will have more information, and more fun than any one at PEZ headquarters could provide.

We look forward to seeing you in July.

Collecting Tips

As I take pen in hand to write this story, thoughts and ideas rush into my mind so fast, it is difficult to set them down in an orderly fashion. Therefore, please bear with me if I get off on a tangent or ramble on about some minor point.

For many years, we have collected small objects. There must be something profound and inherent in human nature to want to have, to enjoy, and arrange small interesting objects.

When people feel sad, overwhelmed, or under the weather, they turn to their hobby collections. And the comfort and renewed familiarity they find there in their carefully arranged collections, acts as a panacea for their spirits. Before long, they are feeling "up" again... enthusiastic for fresh conquests.

First of all, I feel that there are really no "right ways" or "wrong ways" to collect. Everyone who is involved in a collecting type of hobby will inevitably develop their own methods.

This essay is only to give a few pointers from a seasoned collector. And if you see something here that you can adapt to your own needs... well that is great... feel free to use our suggestions.

This month, we will talk about collecting tips at toy shows, flea markets and the like.

When planning a day of shopping at a toy show or flea market, it pays to make a little effort up front for possibly a more successful outing.

First off, always wear clothing that has a good supply of roomy pockets. Get two of those plastic type handle grocery bags... put one inside the other for strength. This type will fit neatly over your wrist and leave both hands free.

You can keep your essentials, car keys, wallet, etc., in your least used pocket. In your handiest pocket, put a roll of \$25 in singles and a couple of five's, and a PEZ.

In another pocket, have these items readily available; several stubby sharpened pencils, small note pad, list of PEZ with dollar value, PEZ hobby cards showing your name, address, phone, few slips of paper with Larry LaFoe's name and address.

Now... here you are... you have paid your admission price to the show and had your hand stamped. You set out to search 50 or more tables of collectible objects. Remember now... you have both hands free and small bills in your pocket. Probably, you have set some budget on your day... say maybe \$200.

Our first technique is to make a rapid scrutiny of the whole show. After all, you don't want to spend \$100 at table 11, if there is a possibility there will be PEZ items you would rather have on table 32.

Okay now... at table 7 by the back wall, you come unto a PEZ you want... and the price is right... here is what you

do. First you examine it gently and decide yes, you want it. Never, never lay it back down on the table. No! You say "I will take this" as you hold it firmly in one hand and whip out your money with the other. It saves time to have the right change. Put it in your bag and express thanks.

One time, I expressed glee at the find, and the vendor snatched the PEZ right out of my hand, and said he decided not to sell it. Best to keep a "Poker Face" till you have it in your bag or pocket. Move on.

Now suppose you see three identical PEZ, and you think... well... "I should buy all three to have some good trades." However, once again, you want to scan all tables and get the best you can out of your \$200 allowance. So this is where your pad of paper and pencils come in handy. You whip these out now... and make a quick note: three Popeye Table 17. If the tables are not clearly marked... say to the vendor... what number is this table? Remember, sometimes a vendor will rent five tables, and bring in several friends to help. So it is helpful to know the table number. Sometimes there will be HOBBY BUSINESS cards and you could pick up one of these and write on the back THREE POPEYE'S. It is helpful to have also a phone number.

That way... later on if you cannot remember when you saw the PEZ... you can say to the show organizer... which way is it to table 17. They usually can direct you to it, or look it up on the layout chart. This tip is especially helpful for very large shows.

Also... maybe a few days later, you are wishing you had purchased the PEZ. Then you can call the vendor. Many vendors welcome this post-show type of sale. But of course, now your cost may be up. You will have to pay for the phone call and the shipping. And do not be surprised if the cost you noted on your pad is lower than the POST-SHOW PRICE. Demand and interest can drive a price up.

The little slips with Larry's address on will come in handy if you get a chance to tell someone about this wonderful newsletter.

Now, of course, at many really hectic shows, where collectors are bumping elbow to elbow, you are better off to make your purchase immediately. Just ask first if you "can do better on the price." If the price is right, go ahead and buy it. Probably when you come back, the PEZ will be sold. You have to use your best judgment here.

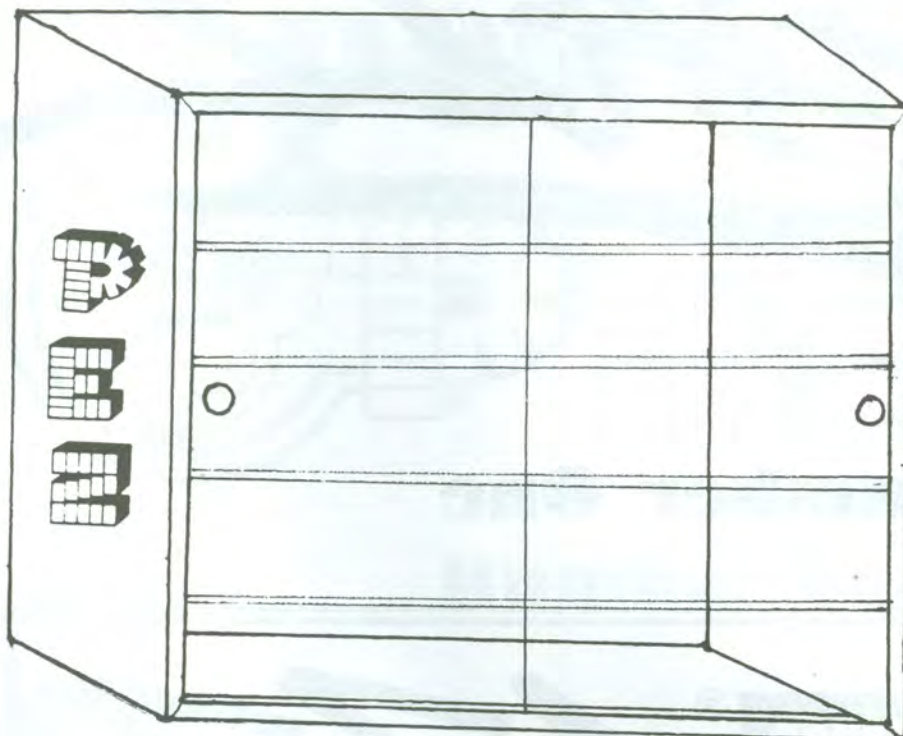
Sometimes, when you don't see any PEZ for sale, you can whip the PEZ you brought from home out of your pocket. Ask "DO YOU HAVE ANY OF THESE?"

Lots of times vendors have stuff under the tables or back home... and you could get some PEZ that way, too.

Remember... "let the buyer beware..." have a good general knowledge of the value of different PEZ. Study over the Welch, Patek, Sternfeld listings or the Edelman price guide before you shop.

Nostalgic

PEZ convention lures those who enjoy reliving past

In PEZ vernacular there are names like Mr. Ugly, Big Nose Cow and Full-Bodied Santa.

In any language, they're expensive.

But for people like Richard Geary of Madison and Kay Spurgeon Young of Syracuse, Ind., they're a part of life.

"It's just a lot of nostalgia from when they were a kid," Geary explained about the attraction of collecting rare PEZ candy dispensers, some given strange names by collectors. As he talked, he oversaw the second annual PEZ convention at the Travelodge in Mentor yesterday.

"It's just their way of relieving the past. PEZ has been a part of every childhood," Geary said.

Actually not every childhood, as the plastic dispensers only were introduced in this country in 1952. The first models in Europe in 1949 looked more like cigarette lighters as the idea of using character heads was still to come.

Collecting PEZ and the various memor-

abilia surrounding the candy and toys still is a hobby waiting to hit the big time, enthusiasts said. But that does not mean great strides have not been made, said David Welch of Murphysboro, Ill.

Prices on PEZ collectibles have about doubled in the past three years as popularity grows, said Welch, who published a full-color PEZ collecting guide.

"Most people just like the way they look. But I think the primary thing is nostalgia," Welch said. "They have the stuff as a kid. They remember it."

"You'll see people will come here and spend thousands of dollars and you will see people who will not pay more than \$10 for something," Welch said.

Young falls somewhere between those two groups as she wrote a check for \$185 to one dealer for a handful of PEZ dispensers. The crown jewel was a Full-Bodied Santa, which she said often sells for \$100 or more.

"They're small, we live in a condo, and I think they are cute," said Young, explaining her attraction to the hobby. "I feel they are a good investment. They'll go up."

As one of only two dispensers that feature the entire body of a character, instead of just a head, her new Santa PEZ is unique in a somewhat limited hobby.

Collectors do not know exactly how many different PEZ heads there are, but they seem to agree on numbers around 250. With variations on the basic models, Richie Sternfeld of New York City said he has more than 700.

Lorrie Schubert of Akron, with a collection of about 25 PEZ heads, told a story that Geary said is common in the PEZ world.

"I thought I was the only weirdo," she said while looking over a display of memorabilia. "I didn't know there were other people who (collected)."

Geary, who has about 225 PEZ dispensers, promised there will be a third annual and fourth annual and a fifth annual convention.

"This is my baby. I'll do it every year now. It's my baby now. I'll keep it going and help the hobby grow."

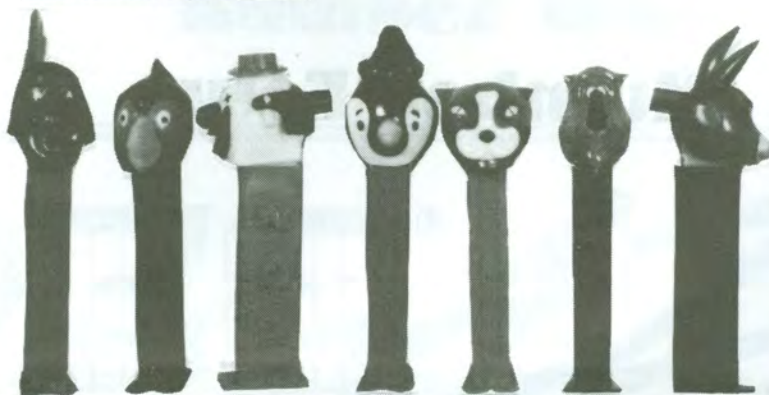

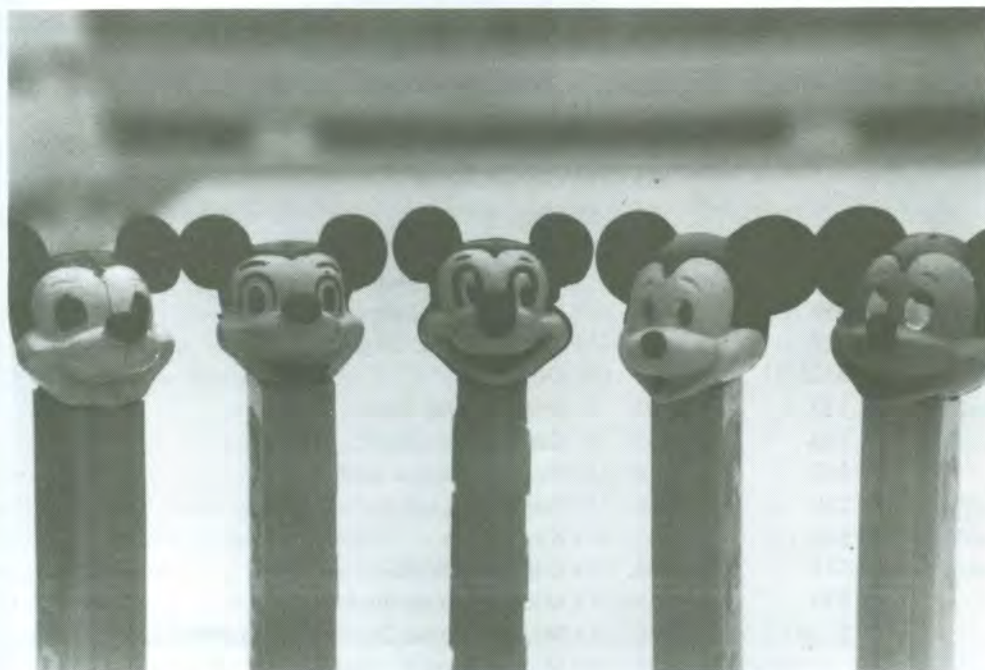

IT'S MICKEYS TURN



by Johann Patek

With the acquisition of David Welch's PEZ book I spotted a till then unfamiliar variation of a painted Mickey Mouse. I didn't have it in my collection so it was on my want list. Sue Sternfeld was able to supply me one for a reasonable price. Now I had the version with the pink painted face. Lucky as things sometimes are I bought an extensive collection with a batch of those painted Mickeys. There were two white painted Mickeys also inside. Were they genuine. So I approached the boss of the plastic factory that once made these Mickeys. He had become a very fine friend over the years and if asked about a special PEZ problem he often knows the answer. The very first Mickeys were sprayed or sometimes painted white by using a primitive sort of masking provision to keep nose, eyes, head and ears black. These Mickeys were produced without the Disney copyright stamping in the back of the head. When the copyright was licensed they had to alter the color to a fleshy pink with the eye-surroundings, eyebrows and mouth black. A complicated masking provision had to be made to leave the black details in unpainted condition. Spraying and painting became difficult for the outworkers as the paint crept under the mask to easily. So a solution was invented by gluing a separate pink plastic face on a new molded head with a recess to accept the depth of this face. Mickey - Original was born. According to David Welch's book we should call the painted faced Mickeys also original with the addition "painted face" although both originals are completely different. This Mickey original was made with big and small ears. The big ear variation is the more recent one. Later it was obvious that parts of the plastic face were easy broken off and a new design was invented by using a thicker plastic face with

painted on eyes and a nose protruding from the back of the head through this mask. Mickey - Remake A was born and is regarded as the sturdiest of all Mickeys as nothing could be scratched or broken off. The only disadvantage of Mickey - Remake A was that its nose was not pointed enough upwards. So Mickey - Remake B came into play with a tiny glued on nose pointing upwards. (This nose was also used as Popeyes pipe!) Again this nose was easily broken off and eaten by kids together with the candy and eventually the recent issue of Mickey 1989 appeared (not pictured).

Most of you will have in your junk box a Mickey Original with parts or the complete face missing. A clever guy might think why not converting it to a painted face variety? This is not possible as the painted face version has eyes and eyebrows cast as a recession into the head. Also Mickey Original has a recession in the head to accept the plastic face whereas the painted Mickey has not. So keep your eyes open before you buy!

PEZ DE RESISTANCE

Self-proclaimed Pezheads turn candy dispensers into hot collectibles

Sue Sternfeld's answering machine welcomes callers to Pez Central, and her Queens, N.Y., living room is lined with more than 700 of the whimsical, pop-up candy dispensers. No doubt about it, Sue Sternfeld is a Pezhead. "We have to have them all," says Sue, 34. "It's a disease."

It seems to be catching. Sue and her husband, Richie, 47, estimate that there are 300 to 400 Pezheads in the U.S., with more popping up all the time. Pezhead Mike Robertson of Dripping Springs, Texas, says he has 250 subscribers to *The Optimistic Pezzimist*, the bimonthly newsletter he publishes. "For years, we Pez collectors thought we were weirdos," says Sue, who met Richie while trading Pez dispensers last year. "Now we're united in this - whatever this is. Pez is going crazy, and we're all coming out of the closet."

For the uninitiated, Pez candy (short for peppermint in German) came to the U.S. in 1952 from Austria and soon after began to be sold in novelty dispensers to spark sales. Since then Pez Candy, Inc., based in Orange, Conn., has created hundreds of different containers - no one has cataloged them all - based on pop-cultural themes. Best-selling models include Mickey Mouse, Roadrunner and Santa Claus; the most valuable include a bride, a cowboy and Mary Poppins. The Sternfelds recently paid \$600 for a pear, and Maryann Kennedy, 59, a Marshall, Minn., nursing administrator who is another champion collector, bought a Make-A-Face model for more than \$400. "When I buy one that is really rare, I get a tremendous rush," says Sue. "It's a tremendous high."

For the Sternfelds, who live off their sales of baby-boom memorabilia and Richie's disability pension (he injured his hip in 1976 while an employee of the New York City Sanitation Department), that's what makes Pez-collecting fun. "I can't imagine ever stopping," says Sue. ■

"Take a look at them," says Pezhead Sue Sternfeld. "They're soooo cute!"
