

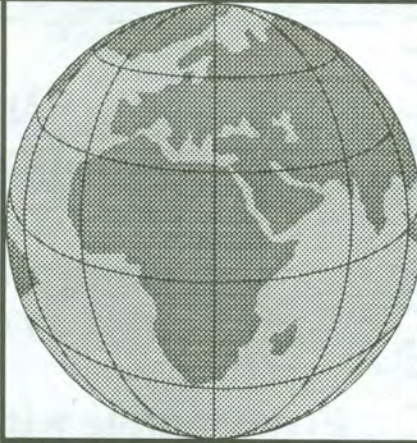

Collectors are popping up to say PEZ

Think PEZ. Think about all the little plastic containers you used to whine for at the drugstore, the ones with the character heads on top. Remember how you and your friends used to tell each other, "Say PEZ!" and then pop up the character's head to reveal a little piece of candy – a sweet-tart taste reminiscent of children's chewable aspirin.

Now think Christie's, the international auction company with galleries in New York. Christie's, the one that makes headlines with the record prices hammered down for art by the masters. Now, Christie's is about to auction off 20 lots of PEZ dispensers on June 19 in its New York City gallery. Politics, it would seem, isn't all that makes strange bedfellows.

As odd as it may seem, Christie's and PEZ are about to be linked together in collecting history.

Actually, according to Timothy Luke, the PEZ connection isn't that unusual. Luke, a specialist in toys and dolls at Christie's, is helping to oversee the upcoming sale, one that marks the first time a major auction house has dealt in PEZ. The way he describes it, Christie's is dipping its toes in the pool of collectibles with this sale, much the way it did last December when lunch boxes were offered for sale. That venture into what was Luke calls "pop culture collectible" was so successful that another lunch box sale is set for early this summer. "We thought it would be interesting to see what the market is like on PEZ," he explained.

Approximately 100 items are to be offered, a "small part of an extensive collection" belonging to Sue and Richie Sternfeld of Glendale, N.Y. Probably the rarest of the offerings is a "soft plastic head prototype" of Donald Duck with a special base. It is expected to fetch in the neighborhood of \$300 to \$500.

Other PEZ items include various Warner Brothers figures (with eight or nine dispensers in the lot, \$75-\$125 is the preauction projection); some super heroes dispensers, including the Hulk, Batgirl and Captain America (estimates \$250-\$350); and some Disney characters (Mickey Mouse, Donald Duck, Dumbo and Pinocchio, with estimates of \$320-\$420), as well as some "unlicensed" heads. In this category are a spacegun, a fullbodied robot and a group of whistle heads, also known as Merry Music makers.

Additionally, a PEZ dispenser premium in mint condition in its original bag with a small version of the movie poster from the 1986 motion picture "Stand by ME" will be offered. In this nostalgia-packed movie, one of the protagonists states that if he could only have one food to

eat for the rest of his life, the decision would be an easy one: cherry PEZ, hence the tie-in. This lot is expected to sell in the \$200 to \$300 range.

PEZ, continues Luke, is "a very emotionally-based collectible." Combining the elements of "candy, fun and childhood," he thinks it is a natural Christie's as it tries this new market. The PEZ heads, he says, "document characters popular at a definite age, so there's a historical aspect to them. People who grew up with PEZ enjoy being a part of this collecting phenomenon," the Christie's specialist concluded.

Scott McWhinnie isn't surprised that PEZ is a "hot" collectible, and as president and CEO of PEZ Candy Inc., he should know. "The collectors have been out there forever," he says from his office in Orange, Conn. The collecting part is positively predictable, but what does surprise him is "the price range they've reached," as evidenced by PEZ's new-found acceptance at Christie's.

Even though McWhinnie sees PEZ containers as a natural for collectors, he insists that the company is not in the market of making collectibles, but of selling candy to today's kids. "I can't manufacture an antique candy container," he maintains. But he is well aware of the impact which today's decisions have on tomorrow's collectibles market.

For the past decade, the ultimate decisions about what heads will be made (and which ones won't) have been McWhinnie's. He acknowledges that his decisions are a combination of gut feeling and market research. Evidently, this combination for making decisions is a good one, for the company's history is one of growth, "and we are still growing."

PEZ candies were not originally developed with children in mind, the president notes. In 1927, a giant of the Viennese food industry named Eduard Haas III formulated a mint, a "high quality compressed candy." He named it PEZ, short for the German word *Pfefferminz*. First marketed as a substitute for cigarettes, the mint was not sold in a special container until 1950. Initially, there were no character head figures; instead, the containers resembled

disposable lighters. Then, in 1952, the candy made its appearance in America, where market research showed that children would readily accept the product if popular figures were featured on the containers. And the rest, as they say, is history.

At any given time, McWhinnie estimates, there are some 40 "active" heads in the line sold in America. The containers themselves are made in a number of countries overseas, and then packaged with the Connecticut-made candy. Over time, he estimates, there have been "hundreds and hundreds of heads, not thousands and thousands. Some collectors claim to know the number and have them all, but I bet they're wrong."

Each dispenser is sold with two rolls of candy for approximately \$1; packs with three rolls of candy sell for about a quarter more. The candy is also available separately, without a dispenser. "We sell 10 times as much candy as we do dispensers," he notes. "What's the good of having a razor without a blade?"

Today, PEZ comes in lemon, orange, grape and strawberry. The newest of these flavors is grape, which replaced cherry in the early '80s. After the mention of cherry in "Stand By Me," devotees of the flavor hoped it would be restored. But McWhinnie notes that the company is concerned with the future, not the past, and the hoped-for cherry revival never materialized. It seems that market tests showed children associated the cherry flavor with medicine, and that cherry "is not a good kids' flavor. Grape is better. Which would a kid rather have: a cough drop or a peanut butter and jelly sandwich?" Case closed.

Some PEZ dispensers are made with seasonal themes. These lines, sometimes with slight variations over the years, include Santa and Snowman for Christmas; Easter Bunny, Chick and Lamb for Easter; Witch, Skull and Pumpkin for Halloween; and Boy and Girl in Love, of course, for Valentine's Day.

Other PEZ heads come and go, and the list reads like a who's who in kiddie pop culture: Bozo the Clown, Daniel Boone, Mary Poppins, Popeye, Garfield, Bullwinkle Moose. Some of the heads are non-licensed: like Baseball Glove, Psychedelic Flower, Arithmetic (complete with a miniature slide rule) and Spaceman, to name a few.

The newest line features Flintstones heads, a tie-in with the upcoming motion

picture ("But we're out first.") Hitting the stores within the past two months, the dispensers feature Fred, Barney, Dino and Pebbles. There will be no Wilma, and no Betty. "Wilma would not make a unique PEZ head," he says, just as there has never been a Superman. "Think about Superman," McWhinnie proposes. "His head looks just like any guy's head. That's not interesting." He should know. What about next year? McWhinnie isn't telling.

He is also reluctant to talk of the business side of the PEZ company. Privately owned, the company employs about 120 people and made \$18 million in retail sales last year. The president does offer, however, that there is no museum and no historian for PEZ. His job, he stresses, is to "concentrate on next year, and the year after that." For the market which he hopes to please - today's children - "knows nothing about nostalgia. But they're collectors. They get a Mickey Mouse and they want another dispenser. They have one, and they want more."

As for his own collection, "I don't have any!"

Charles Beesley, on the other hand, has PEZ dispensers - lots of them. By his calculations, he is lacking only six dispensers to complete his collection. For avid collectors like this St. Michaels, MD., resident, there is but one ultimate goal: to own one of every PEZ dispenser ever made. By his own admission, this is no easy task, when one considers the fact that in addition to American PEZ dispensers, there are also foreign lines. "They're tough to get," he says.

Other dispensers that make PEZ collecting challenging are the ones manufactured for special occasions. The ones marking the Sarajevo Olympics are especially prized, as is the Space Man PEZ designed for the Knoxville World's Fair. Then there are PEZ heads that were simply prototypes, never manufactured on a grand scale. These make collecting a complete set even more challenging.

Beesley turned to PEZ when collecting glass candy containers became too difficult and too expensive. About five or six years ago, he said, he found that \$10 would buy a bag full of PEZ items at a flea market. But now, "they've kind of dried up." Lately, he sees that PEZ collecting is "pricy," and he fears that momentum from the upcoming Christie's auction will "make it pricier still."

That leaves advertising as the best way for

The New Collectible

PEZ seems to be imbedded in the American consciousness. Almost everyone born after World War II can remember a favorite PEZ dispenser. It's like the glazed expression people get when they uncover any buried childhood memory, "Oh yeah, PEZ . . . my favorite was Popeye or Casper, or the one that was like a cigarette lighter!"

Just consider that in the past two years, this candy has been featured in TV episodes of *Thirtysomething*, *Empty nest*, and *Seinfeld*. Articles featuring PEZ have appeared in *People*, *U.S. News and World Report* and the *Wall Street Journal*. Even the prestigious *Christie's East* normally known for more "respectable" collectibles, recently included several lots of PEZ in auction. Admit it - you want to know more about these silly plastic candy dispensers, don't you?

Interestingly, PEZ was not always targeted for children. The inventor, Austrian Edward Haas, developed the candy in 1927 as an alternative to smoking for adults. The word PEZ is actually an abbreviation of the German word for peppermint: pfefferminz. As hostilities increased in Europe, the candy ceased production until the late 1940s when it reappeared with the now well-known gimmick of a mechanical dispenser.

The Haas Food Company set up its US operations in December, 1953 for PEZ in New York City. The original dispensers, called "regulars" by collectors, did not have heads. In fact, for the first few years, Haas and his right hand man in the U.S., Curt Allina, still marketed the candy as an adult item. Not until 1957 were heads introduced

and the marketing geared toward children. Until the early 1970s, all PEZ products were produced in Austria and shipped by boat to the U.S. company. No manufacturing facilities existed in the United States until the company transferred to Orange, CT in 1974 where it still manufactures candy to this day. Virtually all dispensers were made outside the U.S. in Austria, Hong Kong, Yugoslavia, Mexico and more recently China. Today collectors want them all!

Organized PEZ collecting is really only a phenomenon of the past four or five years, but already the hobby has generated enough interest to sustain two collector's conventions: the National PEZ Convention (June 11-12, 1993 in St Louis) and PEZ-AMANIA III (July 9-10, 1993 in Willoughby, Ohio) and a newsletter, "Positively PEZ."

What makes these darn things so popular with collectors, you ask? There are a multitude of reasons. First, they are affordable, at least for now. Of the approximately 250 different heads produced to date, probably 100 of them can be found for under \$25 each. At least 50 are still available worldwide in retail stores, which leads us to reason number two - they're available. Nothing discourages new collectors as much as not being able to add items to their collection on a regular basis.

Third, the variety of heads offers something for everyone. There aren't many hobbies where woman and men both avidly collect, but that's the case with PEZ. The appeal is overwhelming with "cute" heads such as animals and PEZ Pals, licensed heads such as those by Disney, Warner Brothers and Marvel Comics, and more "manly" heads such as Frankenstein, Astronauts, Eerie Spectres, and the Psychedelic Eye (the notorious "hand holding eyeball"). Holiday collectors will find four different Santas (including a full-bodied version) and five different Easter bunnies, and space collectors can shoot for the two Space Guns as well as the three Astronauts and the full-bodied Space Trooper.

Fourth reason - they're colorful. And finally, they're small. A PEZ collection doesn't necessarily have to take over your home like so many collections can.

For those wanting to get started on a PEZ collection, Toys-R-Us, K-Mart, Wal-Mart and other chain stores can be a good

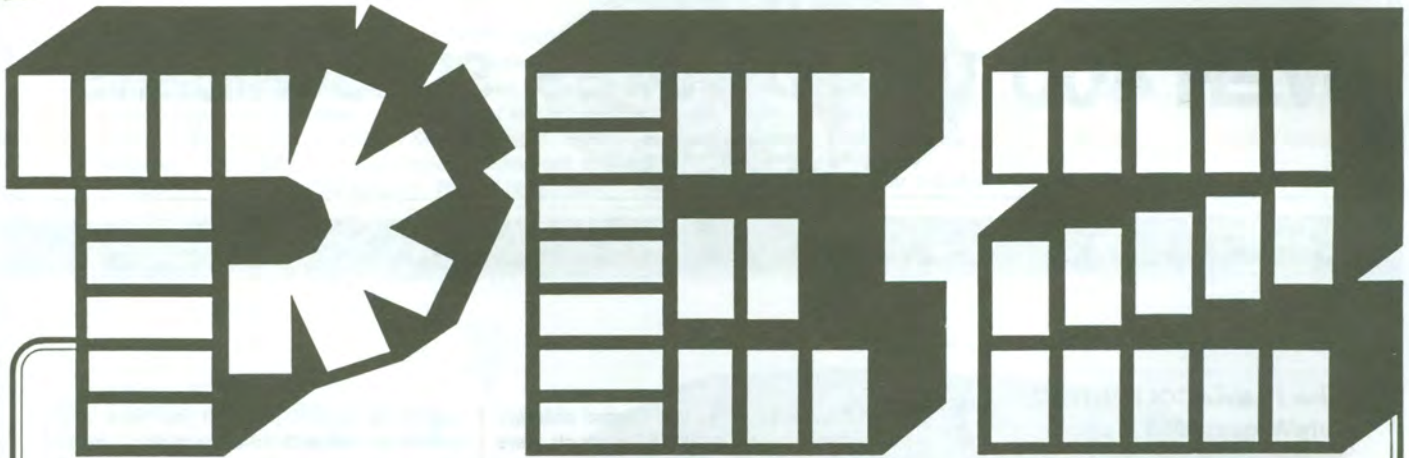
source for current items. If you have any friends or contacts in Canada or Europe, see what they can find for you in stores. There are many current dispensers that can't be found in the United States. Be prepared, however, to pay more for PEZ containers in foreign countries. For older, out-of-production items, toy and collectible shows are becoming an excellent source, although pricing is very uneven among dealers.

Best advice - shop around and locate a knowledgeable collector you trust. A few mail order dealers also offer a good selection of PEZ. Be very conscious of condition also. There is virtually no market for items that are missing pieces or damaged in some significant way. Watch for cracks, non-functioning mechanisms and melt-marks - the kiss of death if it's on the head itself.

As collectors are finding, the PEZ universe is virtually never-ending. Color and design variations of dispensers put the number of different dispensers at close to 700 - maybe more!! Rare colors such as that found on the Pink Pony, the shiny gold Space Trooper, and the yellow Arithmetic, are prized among collectors. Subtle reworkings and redesigns of the first Mickey Mouse dispenser total five or more. Further, there is a fabulous selection of "non-dispenser" items such as advertising, paper inserts (given away with the dispenser) and mail-in premiums. PEZ had a Premium Club in the US almost from the beginning. Although the dispensers themselves cannot be considered premiums as a group, certain dispensers were offered through the mail by the company: the 1950s Space Gun, 1960s Candy Shooter and Golden Glow. The two guns were also sold in stores. Cocoa Marsh Syrup, Donkey Kong, Jr. Cereal and two Austrian banks offered premiums of their own. A more recent offer was in conjunction with the video release of the movie, "Stand by Me."

The general consensus among collectibles dealers is that the PEZ market is a hot one! At a time when we are seeing previously "blue-chip" collectibles go soft, soft, dealers are eyeing Baby Boomer material such as PEZ as their life-

PEZI... A personality for many occasions

Do you remember when you were in grade one? The teacher asked... "What are you going to be when you grow up?"

Everyone had a different answer... "A policeman, a fireman, a nurse." Perhaps this is the sort of wonderful child-like imagination that is responsible for the creation of the PEZ dispensers known as "PEZI."

PEZI came into being in the "Good Old Days" of PEZ... Back when a PEZ dispenser with two packs of candy cost only 33 cents.

The PEZI line continued for some time with new characters being added to keep the series alive and fresh.

All together, some eighteen different disguises were dreamed up. Add to that all the color variations and accessory variations, and a collector would want to own some thirty or more PEZI to have an example of each known kind.

The most common question from new collectors about "PEZI" is "How come he has so many holes?" Of course, the answer is that millions of the little heads were made and appropriate accessories were attached to make up different characters.

In the picture you can see that the Knight and the Sheik are being added to the then existing line. The copy reads "PEZI Boy disguised as the charming sheik from the Kingdom of Pezodonia"... How fun!

For the Knight, the copy reads

"Sir Archibald Pezsquire, the snappy knight with the movable visor." The Knight was available with several different color plumes. And the Sheik was available with several different colors of headbands.

In addition to the eighteen different PEZI listed on the collector's listing on page 9 of this newsletter, there is the ever elusive "Admiral."

The "Admiral" or "Colonial Judge" featured a shoulder length curly white wig. He is seen on various PEZ boxes, but has never actually been found as a dispenser. Was he only an artist concept, or was he actually produced? What a "Find"... A collector's dream... To come across the "PEZI Admiral."

Some "PEZI" characters carried over into the footed era of PEZ. These were Pirate, Fireman, Maharajah, Boy and Girl. Some characters were marketed along with totally different lines of PEZ dispensers. For example, Pirate was featured in a box also containing the Blob, Mr. Ugly, Dr. Skull and One-Eyed Monster. Again the cost was only 33 cents.

There must have been some variations in the size of the PEZI head. We have in our collection a Maharajah with a definitely smaller head and turban than usual. It has been noted that recent Boys and Girls are being found with solid noses. That is to say that they do not have the mustache hole in the nose. And you cannot pull the hair out as before.

At the onset of the PEZI line, concept was that "PEZI" is a very adventurous child who uses various disguises to solve mysteries or have imaginary adventures. For example, there is an elaborate comic that shows how PEZI dresses as a Maharajah to trick the Holy Monkeys into trading the stolen jewels for

larger, but worthless babbles. PEZI then returns the real jewels to the Sultan of Framistan, and receives as a reward a large ruby. And that is how Maharajah got the red gem in his turban!

This comic has fourteen frames and nice artwork. In the corner of the fifth frame, it says "You too can change PEZI's disguises when you collect all PEZI dispensers." "It's fun." This seems to be an invitation, not only to collect all kinds, but possibly puts the idea into a child's mind to pull the accessories off and re-arrange them just like the "Make-A-Face" concept.

It is not known for sure at what point the PEZ Company revised the concept of "PEZI" and the line evolved into being called "PEZ Pals." We could speculate that perhaps when Bride and Groom were introduced, it was sort of inconceivable how PEZI could be both. At any rate, the line is currently listed as "PEZ Pals" on PEZ Company literature.

Since very few were sold, and not many seemed to have survived, the Bride is one of the most expensive PEZ at collector's auctions today. Equally rare and expensive is the Munich Man PEZI. This character wears a derby and a mustache, and was the official PEZ dispenser of the 1972 Winter Olympics.

"Stand By Me" PEZI Boy was a promotion for the movie of the same name. It is a Boy in a package with a mini movie poster. The boy in the movie says that if he could have only one thing to eat the rest of his life... It would be "Cherry flavor PEZ."

In 1982, PEZI Boy and PEZI Girl were re-introduced as Valentine PEZ. And they are still found in some stores around Valentine Day.

It is not known at this time if the PEZ Company plans to re-issue any of the other PEZI line.

Candy man regains lost childhood

There ought to be a support group for guys like Pat Barnes. He was reared in an unthinkable manner.

"I grew up in a very small town in Florida," Barnes begins, "... where there were no Pez."

Pez candies are a veritable institution of childhood. Never mind that they taste as if they were forged of molten talcum powder, that they look like miniature bricks or have about the same texture. The success of the candies probably has depended more on their plastic containers, which defy a child's urge to gobble in large quantities by dispensing a single candy at a time.

Surely everyone under 50 shared childhood with Pez, and yet Barnes did not. So from his Pezless beginnings, he has acquired an embarrassment of riches.

Barnes accumulates Pez-related literature and retail display items, but his collection is made up of about 160 of the 4-inch dispensers. Heads resembling cartoon characters, men and women from history, and holiday figures are attached to boxlike "bodies" that contain the candies.

Yank the head backward and a candy juts forth, roughly from the area of the character's larynx - a feature partly responsible for one of Barnes' apt descriptions of the Pez phenomenon: "It's tacky."

But it's also "something interesting to do," Barnes says. "Life can get pretty damn boring."

Pez started in Vienna in the 1920s as a breath mint dispensed from plain boxes without novelty heads. They came to the United States in 1952, about three years before Barnes was born and three decades before he begins his serendipitous collection.

"My wife had picked up a couple of them at a flea market because she liked them," he says. He became hooked on collecting, and he now helps organize a national Pez convention held each summer in Mentor.

Pat Barnes of Cleveland Heights owns the Goodie Gumdrops candy store in Rocky River and acquires Pez candy collectibles in his spare time.

As far as collectibles go, Barnes finds Pez to be an affordable choice.

"Most Pez dispensers, even older ones, are only \$5 to \$10," he says. That compares with newly manufactured models that sell for about \$1.

But things Pez have become highly desirable. Barnes has seen antiques dealers hike prices on the dispensers, trying to cash in on Pezmania.

They'll tell him things like. "This one is very unusual, because it was made in Czechoslovakia." Then Barnes tells them there's nothing unusual about that. About five Eastern European and Asian countries manufacture the dispensers.

Hard-core connoisseurs know their Pez, and have grabbed a

healthy chunk of the rarest items. Barnes is still missing a "Make-A-Face" dispenser that has been advertised at auction for \$1,000 minimum bid. The model came out in the '60s, and featured a head with changeable accessories.

"It was like the Pez Mr. Potato Head," Barnes says.

Lacking as Barnes' collection might be in the elusive "Make-A-Face," it looks impressive enough displayed on the tiered stand he built. The characters are aligned on risers like the Pez Family Singers gathered for choir practice.

In attendance are Mickey, Goofy, Pluto, Cricket, Donald Duck and nephews Huey, Dewey and Louie, the Smurfs, Kermit and Miss Piggy, Halloween pumpkins and monsters, Christmas angels, Batman and Spiderman - to name a handful.

Barnes does own some highly collectible Pez items, such as the "Candy Shooter" from the 1970s. To hear Barnes tell it, it took someone from outside Pez to point out that the company had made a toy gun designed to be pointed into the mouths of babes. (Pez elected to cease and desist production.)

"These are actually clip-fed," Barnes says, pulling a classically shaped Pez dispenser from the bottom of his 'Candy Shooter.' "You load the sucker and it shoots candy into your mouth."

Barnes now orders Pez by the case for his new candy store, Goodie Gumdrops in Rocky River. Still, even the sum of the most avid Pez collectors find the candy itself beneath contempt.

As for Barnes?

"I've been known to eat them by the bowlful." -KAREN SANDSTROM

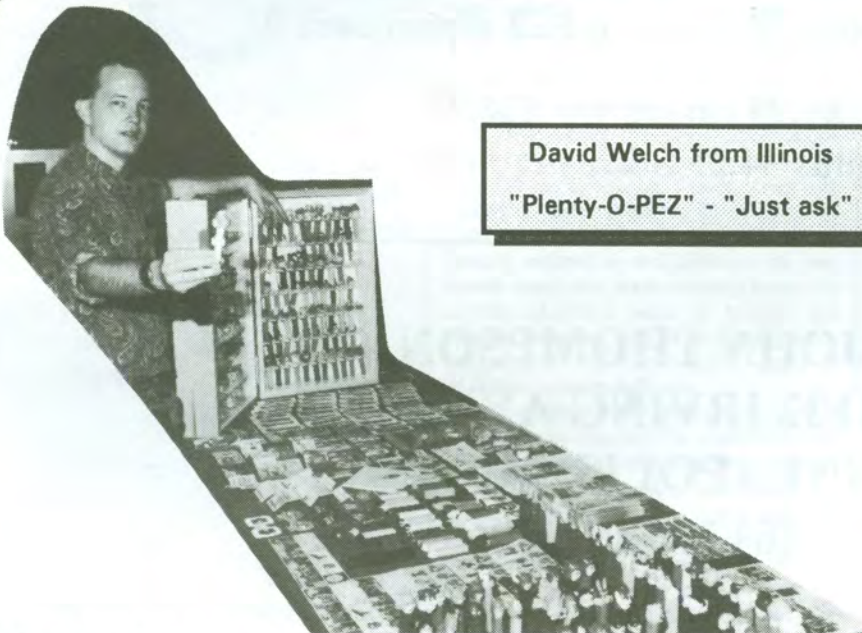

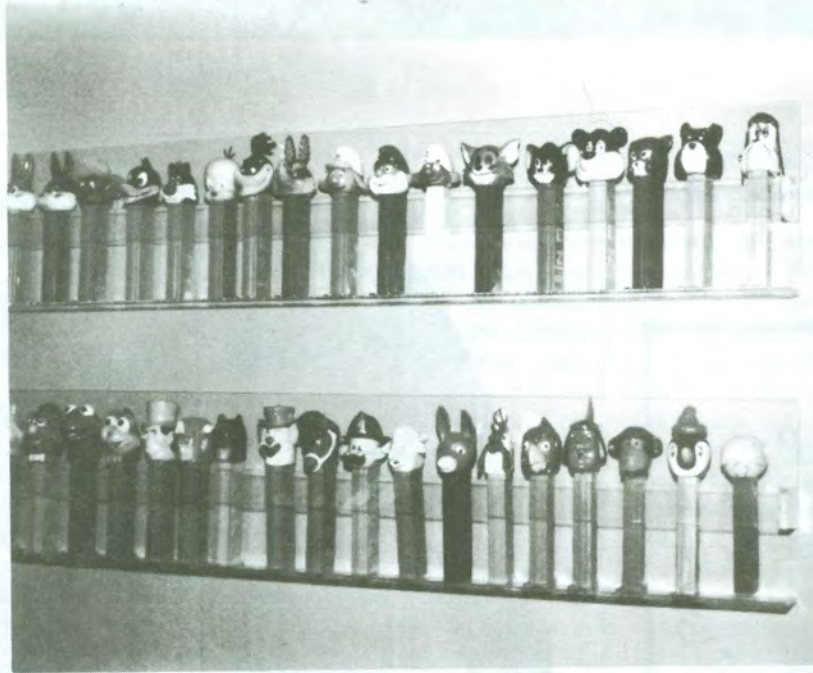

preservers. Since there is currently no reliable and/or thorough price guide available, PEZ prices are still, almost without exception, on their way up. In fact, the Holy Grail of dispensers, the complete Make-A-Face, has sold twice in 1993 for over \$1,000! most of the other rare dispensers such as the Bride, pear, Pineapple, 1962 Lion's Club, psychedelic Flower, Witch Regular, and 1972 Olympics Alpine Man exchange hands in the \$300 to \$600 range. My book, *A Pictorial Guide to Plastic Candy Dispensers* featuring PEZ, shows all known PEZ dispensers (excluding variations) in full color, and it's a must for all collectors.

Imagine, if you spent \$50,000 you could have one of the top PEZ collections in the world! That's one markin boat, or a rare mechanical bank, or an animation cel with a background. Why not join in the PEZ fun now? -**DAVID WELCH**

serious collectors - and there are at least 300 in the country, in addition to the thousands of less serious buyers - to locate the dispensers they need to complete their collections. Fortunately, PEZ collectors are an amiable group, and fellow collectors cooperate with each other. The newsletter "Positively PEZ," published in Indianapolis, is a major source of PEZ communication. With over 200 paid subscribers, the newsletter offers PEZ information as well as swapping and selling ads.

Two collectors' conventions are set for this summer. One will be held June 12 in St. Louis, and another is set for July in Ohio. Additionally, collectors "meet" on computer bulletin boards to swap dispensers. Although, there are collectors all over the country, the greatest concentration of them seems to be in New York and New Jersey.

To begin a collection of PEZ, Beesley recommends buying all the new dispensers as they become available at drug, discount or chain toy stores. In addition to the Flintstones, he suggests that new collectors get Peter PEZ, a remake of an older clown head. It is not necessary to buy every color stem available - only the heads are of importance to collectors.

As a collection becomes more advanced, it will contain dispensers without "feet," which were made before 1987. The most desirable of the dispensers include Make-A-Face PEZ, a dispenser from the '70s that resembled Mr. Potato Head with removable facial features. There are only about two dozen of these available today, Beesley estimates, and although he personally seeks one, he is unwilling to pay the current advertised price of \$1,300. (Of course, he notes, this is a bargain when compared to the recent auction price of \$1,800 for a Make-A-Face.)

PEZ collectors can estimate the age of dispensers by checking the patent numbers on the stem. Early containers have numbers in the 2-million range. Higher numbers indicate later patents. This numbering system is how collectors determine originals from remakes, as in the case of Peter PEZ, for instance. A \$5 price at a flea market does not necessarily indicate that the dispenser is old.

The years from the mid-70s to mid-80s are considered lean years for PEZ collectors, because the company produced a limited number of new heads. This was a response to pressure from consumer groups to make heads without small parts which children could swallow. Because of this, today's dispensers are comparatively indestructible.

Displaying PEZ containers has been made easier because footed ones can stand up unassisted. For exhibiting collections of older, footless PEZ containers, a peg board display is one option. Some collectors have fashioned display cases expressly for PEZ; these cases are available for sale among collectors.

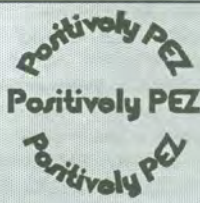
For the most part, though, "collecting PEZ is easy and fun. Every kid can relate to PEZ," Beesley concludes. They're small, and a collection requires little maintenance. They don't break easily, and, most importantly, "PEZ is neat."

For Your Information

PEZ prices are ever-fluctuating. For the most part, they have been rising, and should continue to rise with the added publicity from Christie's auction. In some instances, though, the prices have fallen, as in the case of Green Hornet, when an additional source of supply flooded the collectors' market. Over the years, a few mistakes have been made along the way, but that seems to be a part of the "human condition."

It is our hope that as we go forward into 1994, that we will all "pull together," and work in harmony for the enjoyment of all PEZ Collectors.

Since so many "PEZ Pals" have spent a great deal of time and effort to promote this hobby, we refrain from listing individual names.

Instead, we say a BIG THANK YOU to one and all. Thanks for the happy PEZ memories in the summer of 1993.
