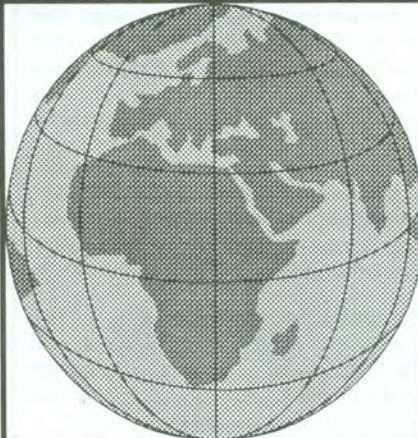
**PEZ Candy  
Dispenser turned  
Pop Culture Icon  
by Sue Sternfeld**

**T**hey are a familiar mainstay of the checkout aisles of supermarkets - an impulse buy, tucked between the candy bars and keychain flashlights. When you were a kid you owned one. Now they pop up at yard sales, flea markets and antique shows. If you get a kick out of PEZ and want to pick up a few of these tchatchkees of your youth, believe it or not, there is an organized network of PEZ collectors out there.

Collecting PEZ has existed as an organized hobby for only the past five or six years. There are PEZ fanzines, PEZ newsletters, even PEZ conventions! The recent rise in PEZ popularity can be seen in the media. Television shows such as Married With Children, Cheers, Thirtysomething and Murphy Brown have all made mention of PEZ. The hip Seinfeld show did a whole episode revolving around the commotion caused by a Tweety dispenser at a piano recital.

**HISTORY OF PEZ**

Many collectors don't realize how long PEZ has been around. The candy was created in 1927 by an Austrian food

merchant, Eudard Haas III. Haas was a creative businessman with a detailed knowledge of the properties of peppermint oil. he created a small rectangular candy and marketed it as a breath mint, calling it PEZ. The now familiar name for the candy was derived from the German word for peppermint, PfeffErminZ. Some favorite flavors with the European market in the 1930s were anise, eucalyptus, and coffee. Peppermint was always far and away the biggest seller, everywhere PEZ was marketed.

Ahead of his time, Haas was a fervent non-smoker, and advertised PEZ as an alternative to smoking. Popular as a marketing slogan was "Smoking No, Pezzing Allowed." Recently some PEZ advertising metal signs using this phrase, sold at auction in Europe for thousands of dollars. As these rare examples of advertising memorabilia were never used outside of Europe, they are quite rare and desirable to collectors.

In 1939 the bottom fell out of the PEZ

market. The world went crazy all at once and rationing of supplies became intense, and candy products went right to the bottom of the priority lists. As hostilities increased, supplies and manpower decreased. Production of PEZ ceased during the war and it was not until 1948, that Haas was able to once again begin production of PEZ.

So the familiar rectangular peppermint candy was back. Even the blue and gold packaging was the same. In the late 40s, the candies were sold in bags, not meant to be poured out into tins or other containers. Many persons carried their PEZ loosely in pockets, reaching in for one whenever the urge hit them. It was during this time that Haas struck upon the change in PEZ packaging that set the stage for PEZ collecting today.

It's easy to imagine that Haas' company was hearing from customers who experienced melting candies in their pockets, not to mention lint on their PEZ. Haas put his best creative staff to work on the problem, and completely unaware of the ramifications, they developed the plastic box that's still used and beloved today to dispense PEZ. This brilliantly designed gimmick enabled the candy buyer to conveniently take their sweets from the "easy, handy, hygienic pocket dispenser," as one of his advertising slogans of the day trumpeted.

Collectors today call these first, headless PEZ boxes 'regulars.' They were an instant success, selling by the millions across Europe. PEZ was popular before, now it enjoyed an enormous following.

While his product was selling strongly in Europe, Haas kept looking across the

ocean towards that gigantic marketplace known as the United States. Thoughts about how well PEZ would certainly sell in the U.S. kept crossing his mind. Finally, in 1952 he set up distribution and PEZ was introduced into this country. Haas' market research told him to suit the American mentality and their love of games, that they should introduce their product as a line geared toward children. In response to this new direction, fruit flavors were first introduced into the candy line.

More important for collectors today, the first character heads of PEZ boxes were introduced sometime in the 1952-1954 period. It is believed that Mickey Mouse's head graced the first PEZ dispenser marketed in America.

First generation heads from these early PEZ dispensers include original holiday characters such as One-Piece Witch, Original Easter Bunnies A & B, Santa A, Popeye, Mickey Mouse, Donald Duck, Space Gun, and the Full-Bodied Robot and Full-Bodied Santa. These names sound odd in some cases; collectors have derived these names by compiling information from old PEZ advertising materials, displays, and catalogs. Different letter designations are assigned when a mold change takes place. Tom & Jerry A & B simply means that there are two different sets of Tom & Jerry PEZ heads. The second, later set is markedly different from the first one. Either the original molds were lost, or were for some reason no longer usable and new molds were created. In either case, collectors and dealers today use these simple letter designations to differentiate the character heads as they changed.

### COLLECTIBLE PEZ OLD & NEW

Collecting PEZ dispensers and related merchandise has become a popular hobby in a relatively brief time period. One major factor is the ease with which enthusiasts are able to locate and purchase new dispensers. There aren't too many hobbies where you can walk into a grocery or department store and buy items for your collection right off the racks, often for as little as \$1.29. Possibly the number one reason so many people collect PEZ is good-

old-fashioned nostalgia.

There have been approximately 300 different character heads manufactured and available to the general public since 1952. Currently at least 75 different dispensers are available in retail stores in the U.S., most of them selling for \$2.50 or less. Approximately another 150 varieties may be found through PEZ dealers and collectors, costing the buyer between \$5 and \$100. These secondary-market pieces all date from 1952 to present, mostly produced in the States. Generally, dispensers sold only in Europe cost much more in the U.S. than they do in Europe. PEZ isn't very collected across the ocean, compared to the activity in this country. A few dealers and collectors are ambitious enough to travel to Europe and search out PEZ dispensers available only on that continent and ship them back for re-sale, and a couple of European dealers sell mostly to U.S. collectors. Each spring a few of the bigger PEZ collectors and dealers from the U.S. travel to the Netherlands for one of the biggest flea markets in Europe, just to search for PEZ.

Many of the headless dispensers, or 'regulars,' are highly sought after by collectors. The regulars resemble disposable lighters. After the character head PEZ hit the market, the only regulars available were used as premium items. A difficult PEZ to find is the U.S. Zone Regular, a box made in occupied Germany. Most of the buyers were probably American servicemen stationed in Germany. It's logical that not too many of those PEZ dispensers made it back to the States in a duffel bag making this a rare PEZ. Another regular, Golden Glow was a premium available from the PEZ company for ten empty candy wrappers and 25 cents. Two other 'regulars' are Witch Regular (featuring a witch painted on the side), and the Personalized PEZ. To personalize your favorite 'regular' PEZ, you sent in wrappers from your PEZ purchases to the company. In return, PEZ sent a gold sticker and stylus, with which you'd personalize your PEZ.

Another sought-after 'regular' of the early 50s is called the Arithmetic PEZ. This dispenser has three cut-outs on its side. Pulling the outer sleeve from the inner sleeve, the cut-outs expose numbers that multiply across the columns as you pull the dispenser apart to load.

Advertising regulars are very hot with

collectors today. During the 50s, PEZ apparently sold advertising on both a national and regional basis on the sides of its headless boxes. These premiums were often given away at conventions, trade shows and other events. Nobody knows how long PEZ sold advertisements on the boxes and there is no definitive information on how many different ads appeared. Again, the company isn't giving out historical information, so collectors are putting it together themselves. What is certain is that there are previously unknown variations and that these vintage PEZ dispensers are considered hot collectibles in the PEZ world. Two examples of the Advertising PEZ feature "Sports Chief Apparel," with an Indian head, and "Bosch Company."

Due to variables in distribution and marketing, different PEZ dispensers are available in various areas of the country for odd amounts of time. The staggering variety of character heads helps account for the mass appeal of PEZ. Disney characters alone account for nearly 50 different heads, including Jiminy Cricket and Pluto. Foghorn Leghorn and Tweety are two of the 15 Looney Tune characters who sit on top of dispensers. Superheroes and villains such as Captain America and The Joker have their fans. There are monsters, astronauts, historical figures like Daniel Boone, many different trucks, and cute animal heads. Holiday collectors will find four different Santas, nine Easter characters and a variety of witches, pumpkins and ghouls for the Halloween season.

Licensed characters are popular as PEZ heads. Garfield and his friends are staples, the Muppets, Charlie Brown and the Peanut Gang, Popeye (three varieties), Olive Oyl and Brutus, Smurfs, Little Orphan Annie, Bullwinkle, Bozo and Casper the Friendly Ghost are all well-known licensed characters who've spent long periods of time on top of PEZ boxes.

Some PEZ heads stay in production too long. Batman is an example of a popular character who has not had a mold change since the 1960s. This results in a glut of Batman PEZ in the marketplace, and almost no demand from collectors. Wonder Woman is another example. Spiderman was in the same boat, until PEZ changed his mold two years ago. The alterations are minor, they only made his head a bit larger, but the change will create eventual demand for the old version and

## PEZ Advertising in Weiner Magazine – 1952 to 1960

From 1948 to 1966 a so called "Journey magazine" was issued in Austria (*Weiner Magazine*). This magazine contained short-stories and a lot of photos of actresses and pretty pin-up girls.

During 1952 to 1960 about 25 issues of this magazine featured full-color ads on the last page in a typical American-style of advertising. Six different ads are known. Four of them were done by the Austrian artist Gerhard Brause, who did most of the advertising graphics for the PEZ Company, even the rare enamel sign from 1950.

During these years he gave several PEZ-ladies a typical appearance of famous actresses. The 1950s enamel sign and even the ads in *Wiener Magazine* are very similar to Romy Schneider, one of the most famous young actresses in Austria and Europe during the second half of the 1950s.

Brause did four different ads for PEZ which were issued in *Weiner Magazine* from 1954 to 1959.

The spring motif was issued ten times, the winter scene appeared four times and the rain motif with menthol eucalyptus candy was only issued three times on the last page of the magazine.

The classic PEZ-lady on yellow background was issued six times. It shows the PEZ-lady pictured on the enamel sign slightly changed in the face and with a modern hair style.

The first ad of July 1952 shows a Mexican girl and a package of citron candy. This ad was made by an unknown artist and is not signed. It appeared only one time and is the second rarest ad.

The last and rarest ad was shown in September 1960. This ad shows a sun-bathing tourist in a completely different style of graphics from the 1960s. It was designed

by an artist named Rajli and also appeared only one time.

After this period PEZ turned more and more from a product targeting the adult market to that of a toy for children.

This was the primary reason of discontinuing the ads in *Weiner Magazine* in 1960.

These nicely done ads from *Weiner Magazine* are rare in the United States and are very hard to find in Austria and Germany. *Weiner Magazine* published over 200 issues during these years and according to my information only 25 issues contained PEZ ads.

The rarity of the ad corresponds to the number of issues with that particular ad.

a search for the new.

On the other hand, some PEZ heads go away quickly. Little Orphan Annie was only on store shelves for a couple of months. Release of this product was tied to the movie of a few years ago. The movie bombed, and suddenly Annie disappeared from stores. The Smurf PEZ dispensers came out in 1987, were discontinued in 1992, and are already difficult to locate. Charlie Brown character heads are sought after by the baby boomer audience. Kids today don't look for those too much, but older collectors do. Bugs Bunny is always very popular, even though he hasn't ever had a mold change. With Bugs a big seller in retail outlets, collectors would welcome a mold change because it stirs immediate interest. Daffy Duck, Tweety Bird and Sylvester the Cat have all had mold changes, probably in an effort to increase sales, but have never surpassed the always-popular Bugs.

Monsters and other character heads from the 60s are currently hot with collectors. The usual suspects like Frankenstein, the Creature from the Black Lagoon, the Wolfman, Zorro, the Green Hornet and Bullwinkle are on many want lists today. These dispensers are no longer in production, and once they disappear from store shelves, secondary market action drives prices up. Captain America, Batman and The Hulk remain in production thus their values remain much lower.

Some Disney characters are also now out of production, causing them to go up in price. They are Snow White, Peter Pan, Tinkerbell, Pinocchio and Jiminy Cricket.

Flintstones character heads are hot right now. These are absolutely wonderful PEZ dispenser heads. An interesting regional fluctuation currently happening in PEZ collecting is taking place only in California. For some reason, the Dino dispenser (Dino the Dinosaur, from the Flintstones), is selling out state-wide. Speculation is that little kids are mistaking Dino for Barney (they're both purple), and begging their parents to buy him for them. Next year the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles will finally make their long-awaited appearance on

PEZ dispenser boxes. Collector demand should be high for the Turtles.

The hobby now contains some bootleg dispensers which are catching the attention of many collectors. Most are wonderful, better than anything PEZ creates. One maker creates extremely limited edition dispenser heads of Herman Munster, Kato, Pee Wee Herman, the Alien, and the Flash. These are hand made, hand sculpted, hand painted, one at a time. Initial asking price was from \$60 - \$200, and they sold out immediately! Details and colors on these PEZ dispensers are great. The smallest run made is Underdog, only three copies making it into the marketplace. Herman Munster enjoys top spot with the largest run, and that's only 25 copies. When limited edition is banded

around in PEZ collecting, they mean it.

Another bootleg dispenser, the Adolph Hitler PEZ is making the rounds and sought after by collectors as a novelty. It seems that any item of high quality not commonly available finds a market right now if it's on a PEZ dispenser.

#### STARTING YOUR COLLECTION

New PEZ dispensers are sold in nearly every chain of department and drug stores in the United States. Search enough of these stores and you'll eventually see all the dispensers that are in current production. Flea markets, yard sales, antique and collectible shows are fine sources for older, out-of-production PEZ.

Although PEZ collecting is a fairly young hobby, there are dealers buying and selling

dispensers individually and by the entire collection. Collectors have easy access to dealers selling rare and collectible PEZ through publications such as this one. Look through the advertisements and you'll find PEZ dealers.

Collectors should shop around for dealers to buy from, such as they would with any other product. There is currently no accurate or reliable pricing guide available to collectors; as a result, prices vary quite a bit between dealers.

People new to PEZ collecting often ask about keeping PEZ in the original packaging. PEZ in bags cannot be clearly seen or enjoyed. Take your PEZ out of the bags and enjoy them. The cellophane or poly bags have no value. A "mint in the bag" Bozo dispenser should not cost more than a mint, loose Bozo dispenser. At this point in the hobby, logic still plays a role, and dealers are not charging a premium for PEZ in plastic bags.

PEZ on the blister card is another matter. No early PEZ were sold on cards, only in bags or boxes. Some dispensers on cards are nice to keep intact. Over time, these should increase in value if the card itself is unusual. Many have an odd shape, or feature a contest, give-away or other gimmick. These cards are collectible in themselves, and should be kept with the dispenser, mint in the packaging. Down the road the packaging may prove to be more valuable than the dispenser inside. Some examples of dispensers that should always be kept in the original packaging are the 1970s Candy Shooters, the 1980s Space Gun, and the Make-A-Face PEZ. These dispensers are sought after by collectors only in blister packs, and lose much value if they're off the cards. The exception to this rule is the generic pink, blue and yellow striped package. This is extremely common, dull to look at, and will never be worth money. Open those and enjoy the PEZ dispenser inside.

The Stand By Me dispenser is actually a packaged set, and should always be kept in the packaging. This promotional PEZ was given out by Columbia Pictures during the release of the motion picture *Stand By Me*. The original packaging, intact with the dispenser inside, is your proof that this is the promotional item. The set consists of a PEZ Pal Boy, one package of candy, and a miniature poster from the movie. All this comes in a small clear plastic bag stapled on

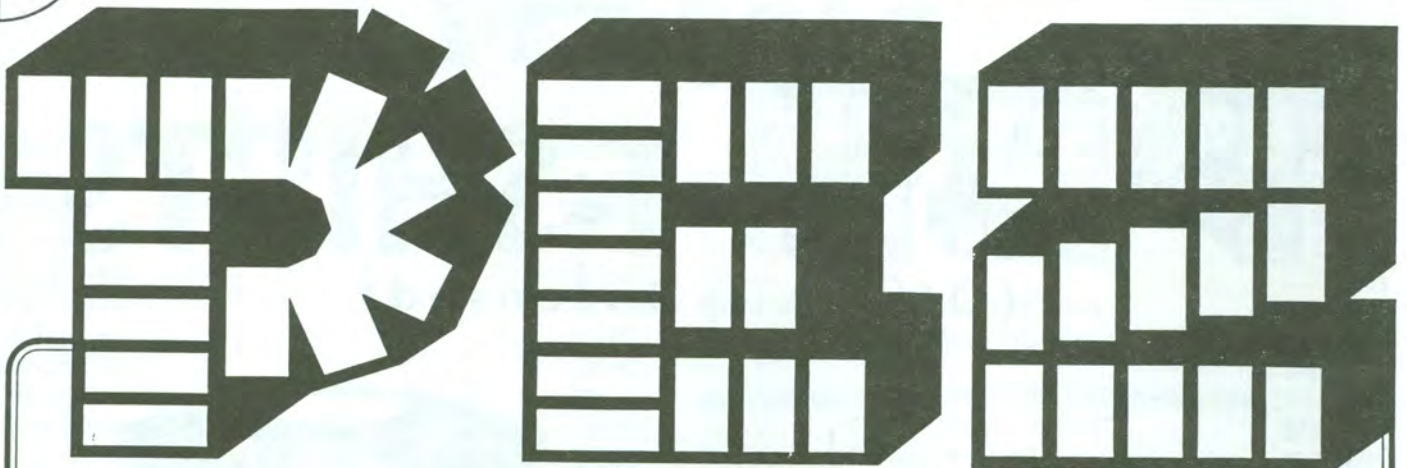

top.

Should you be purchasing PEZ as an investment, keep them all in the original packaging, sort them into boxes, and place them in dark storage. Constant light will affect the colors on the packaging. Be careful not to lean dispensers against things. The plastic has a tendency to react with other materials, especially rubber and other plastics. Dispensers damaged in this manner are referred to as having "Melt Marks."

Try not to buy dispensers that are missing pieces. There is no market for items that are missing pieces or have significant damage such as cracks, melt marks or non-functioning mechanisms.

Focus your collecting attention to the heads of the dispensers. Dispensers made in Austria, Yugoslavia, Hungary and China but this doesn't really affect their collectibility. If you attempt to find one from each country, you'll wind up with a garage full of duplicates.

#### SOURCES

As a wonderful source of information and entertainment, David Welch's book *A Pictorial Guide to Plastic Candy Dispensers* is a must. This full color book sports coated stock pages and pictures most PEZ dispensers, accompanied by descriptions. Although there is no pricing guide, the rarity guide in the book is quite accurate. Welch's book is a great help in your PEZ purchasing decisions.

A good place to start shopping and making price comparisons is through the PEZ hobby's newsletter, *Positively PEZ*. Crystal and Larry LaFoe operate the publication, now in its second year. This bi-monthly features stories, photographs, letters from collectors, information on upcoming PEZ conventions and advertisements buying/selling or trading PEZ in each edition.

Yes, there are get-togethers of PEZ fanatics from across the country. A new convention held in St. Louis, Missouri, this past June, was promoted by David Welch and John "The Cool PEZ Man" Devlin. Attendance was reported to be good, and

plans are being made for another one together the following year.

PEZ-A-MANIA III, held in Cleveland, Ohio, has been celebrating PEZ collecting for three years. Organized by Richard Geary, the first PEZ convention began after Geary decided to see how many of the collectors and PEZ enthusiasts he talked with on the phone he could get together. This first gathering, in 1991, was successful, so he put another one together the following year.

Unlike larger, commercial gatherings, the PEZ convention is low-key with a real friendly atmosphere. The night before the actual sales day, more than 60 dealers and collectors staying at the convention hotel open their room doors, displaying collections and sales stock alike. People move from room to room, getting to know one another, checking out each other's PEZ, and making some deals. Families are often in attendance, with one member of the group the real PEZ fanatic, but everyone takes part.

The following day, the dealer's room opens to the public. Tables are set up around the room, full of PEZ and related merchandise for sale. A television playing a videotape compilation of old PEZ commercials going back to the 1950s, clips of television shows with PEZ dispensers in the episode (yes, *Seinfeld* was included), news broadcasts, and more is featured in the dealer room. An auction, raffles of PEZ dispensers and even games for attendees' children make the show a real family event. Several hundred people attended the PEZ convention in 1993, and plans are already being made for a 1994 show.

Considering that PEZ dispensers contain a food product (actually basically compressed sugar), collectors often wonder whether they may eat old PEZ. The candy will go bad if it gets wet, but will taste the same for a long time if it remains dry. My collection contains a box of 50 year-old anise PEZ that people still eat. It's green and smells very strong, but looks and tastes as fresh as anise PEZ ever did.

There are many attractive aspects to the PEZ collecting hobby. You've got great faces, popular characters, bright colors and the nostalgic appeal. PEZ dispenser collecting is addictive and lots of fun.

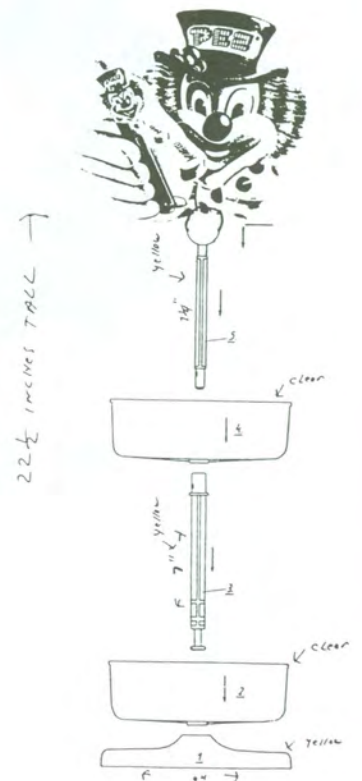

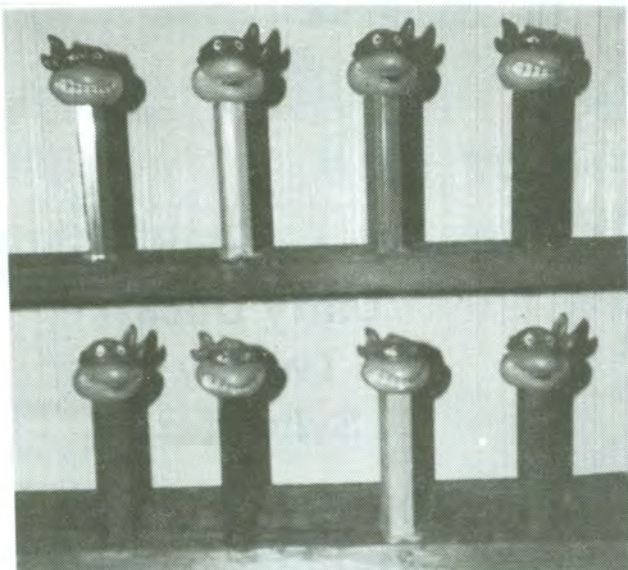

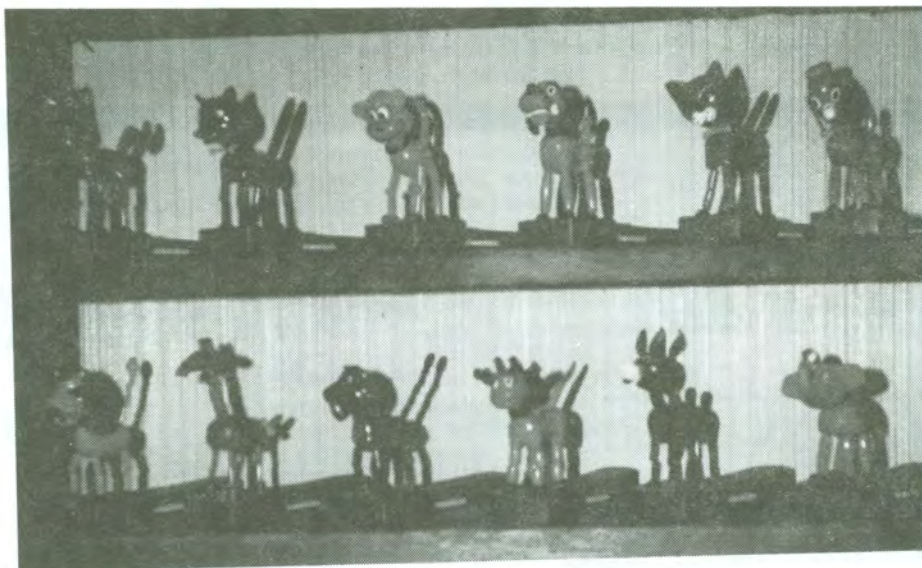

# MARIA STRAUS

## PEZ Questions and Answers

**T**here have been some very interesting questions in our correspondence. We are giving answers as best we know or can find out about them.

If anyone has any additional information, please share it with the "PEZ Pals" through this magazine.

### From California:

**Question...** The Jungle Book story is one of my children's favorites. What character did PEZ make? How can I get some reasonable?

**Answer...** Three Jungle Book characters have been PEZmerized; Mowgli the man cub, Baloo Bear and Louie the ape king.

These have been issued twice, both footless and again with feet. The molds for the faces seem to be the same for both. The color of plastic and the features seem the same for the general supply.

Baloo Bear and King Louie have been found in unusual color combinations also.

These three characters were combined in a Disney PEZ series with Dumbo and Bambi. They were all found new in non-U.S. sales outlets as recent as 1991.

They are not available at the present time, but perhaps they will come again. The factories that eject the PEZ heads make a prescribed number of each character. Then the dies are temporarily retired, so that the machines can be set up to make other characters. Temporarily retired molds may be brought back into production at some future date.

We don't know of any way to get them at a low price right now. Perhaps you could run a wanted ad in *Positively PEZ*.

### From New Jersey:

**Question...** Can you tell us something about 'soft heads'? Why were only a few characters made? Why is 'soft head' Donald Duck so expensive?

**Answer...** As near as we can find out, the 'soft heads' were produced sometime around the middle 1970s. These heads are made of a more pliable plastic, less rigid than all the other PEZ heads. There were a total of eleven characters sold on the market.

The reason that 'soft heads' came into

being was an endeavor to reduce the over abundant inventories of PEZ dispensers in the holding warehouses.

Say, perhaps that the warehouse had a thousand cases of Disney dispensers and the retail orders were coming in for the PEZ line. The company could be "up a creek" to meet the demand, but it had a large inventory of other kinds.

It was thought that if the assembled dispensers and the boxes of heads could be shipped separately, there could be a better distribution and a better turn-over.

In other words, if the company got orders for a specific line, the PEZ heads could now be popped into place. And there would no longer be a large inventory of unsold dispensers.

The 'soft heads' were meant to be a universal dispenser. There is an extra plastic insert that connects to the dispenser mechanism. Then the heads were fitted as needed on the assembled dispenser. The dispenser is not connected to the character head itself as on the 'hard heads'.

The whole idea seemed very feasible and a step toward economy. We can only speculate why they were discontinued and production returned to the 'hard head' type.

Perhaps the six rather gruesome heads offered in the Eerie Spectre series just did not sell very well. Recently, we had a few PEZ laid out for sale at a bazaar. One child wanted to buy Dr. Skull, but his Mom said, "No way, you can buy Fred Flintstone." So perhaps, the parents who paid for the PEZ said, "You can't buy that ugly one." Consequently, the value of the Eerie Spectre's is quite high today as they are in short supply since so few were originally sold.

The remaining five 'soft heads' are in the Super Hero series. Again, two of those PEZ characters are despicable villains, Joker and Penguin of the Batman stories.

So, of the eleven, only three were the kind of toy that most parents would want their child playing with, Batman, Batgirl and Wonder Woman.

The extra plastic piece caused the whole dispenser to be a bit top heavy and it just looked more like a "head on a stick." Whereas, the 'hard heads' appear to be more like a head and a body.

At any rate, the 'soft heads' were short lived.

The Donald Duck and other Disney

character 'soft heads' seemed to have never made it to the mass market. In the summer of 1991, a few of these were brought out into the "light of day." They are considered like a prototype or a sample few.

At first, the only way to get one was if you had something really, really nifty and rare to offer in trade. Now, they are starting to change hands, but you will need to pay more than a month's rent to add soft head Disney to your PEZ collection.

Incidentally, soft head Donald Duck is featured in full color, along with Daffy Duck and Spiderman on the cover of *Forbes* magazine, December 6, 1993 issue.

The lady who wrote up the article didn't seem to have all her facts straight, at least in regards to PEZ. The text on the cover says, "Just one of these five-cent PEZ dispensers auctioned for six hundred and twenty dollars. Actually, we know soft head Donald never sold for five-cents.

### From Washington:

**Question...** We enjoy your articles very much. Your article about PEZ costumes was very fascinating. I never heard about those costumes before. Could you send me photo copy of all the A series and anything else you have?

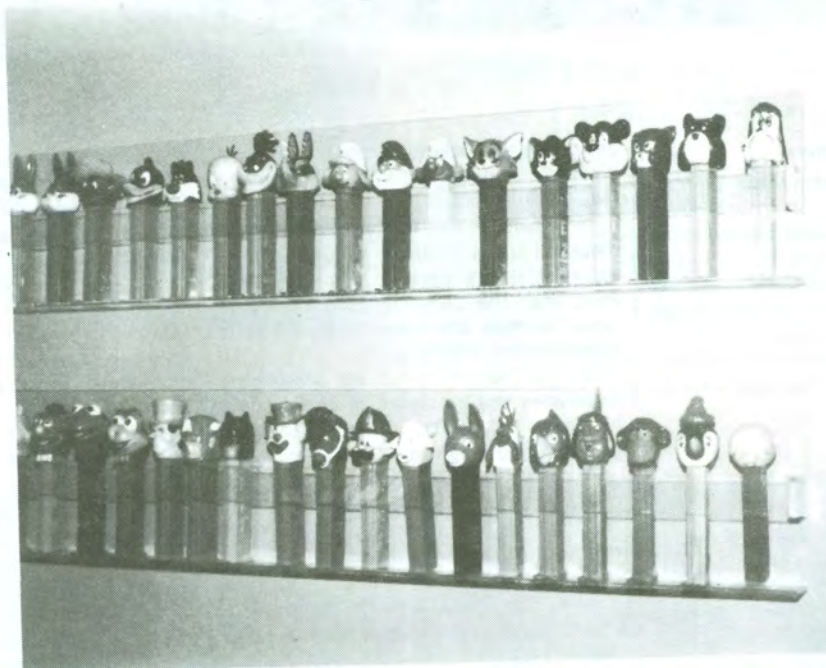
**Question...** What old comic books carried the Super Hero color ad?
