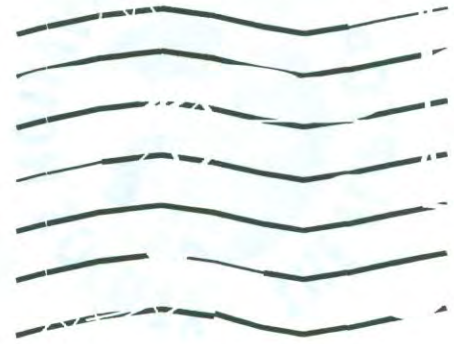

Gary Doss & Nancy-Yarbrough Doss of the Burlingame PEZ Museum came up with a process to tie-die the Regular peppermint dispensers. They were incredible! In addition to keeping the convention alive on-line the whole time, Nancy and Gary sold neat stands that hold 8 PEZ with feet, and they had plenty of Cosmo PEZ toppers as well.

Jim Presnal came up with an incredible idea that I just loved. He was selling PEZRays...X-Rays of dispensers! They really looked cool, especially the guns and Eerie Specters. Steve Glew had several tables with just about every kind of Body Parts, and some cool "Less Than Jake" items. (The band that used PEZ on their album cover) By the way, the band did show up Saturday for the convention. Anyway, Steve also had the new Star Wars PEZ stickers, Merry Music Makers, and several blue Batman with cape.

Ivan Jurkovic & Ivan Jurjevic, being from Slovenia, had a real advantage in the STRANGE category. They had a table full of some really cool color variations, as well as some minor pieces... such as 2 Mary Poppins, Mueslix, Henry Hawks...etc! They also had a few of the new Garfield and Odie PEZ, but their small stock went fast.

It was a surprise and a pleasure to see Sue Wheelis return to the PEZ conventions. Sue had a table with some really rare and unusual stuff. She sold some top dollar dispensers, as well as some of her unique PEZ paper items. She also, at one time during the show, was in possession of the coolest items in the room, the clear Yoda & Darth Vader! I'll have more on them later.

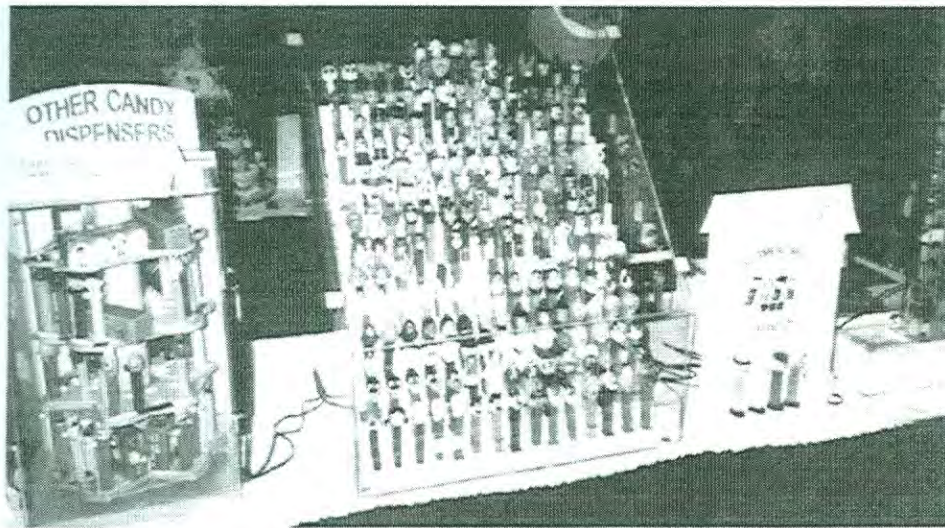
Patrick Kehoe had tons of his PEZ shoes for sale, and his custom replacement FAUX Batman capes...in blue, black and red. The red looks great



Entertainment Extravaganza

After a time of getting acquainted, it was time for Larry's huge Friday night entertainment extravaganza. We were greeted by a live band as we strolled in and took our seats. There was a huge stage with giant screens, theatrical and dance lights, and lots of speakers. In the back of the room was an electronic control center that would rival ABC Monday night football. Big screen TV's, data projectors, lighting boards, audio boards, wireless mics, headsets, VCR's, computers...you name it! We knew we were in for a really big show!

The black tie MC started off the show, and we were treated to several great video productions, live skits,



on the current Witch!

John LaSpina had his usual assortment of hard to find PEZ, with fairly reasonable prices. (Considering what most items were selling for.) John was even lucky enough to buy one of the One Piece Gold Elephants (see last issue) from a walk-in guest!

Then there was Johann Patek and his brother. You talk about a drool factor! Try 3 tables full of RARE stuff, like: Alligators in 6 colors, dozens of transparent stemmed dispensers in every neon color, Disposables, Brides, Grooms, Ringmasters...need I go on? There was a never ending line of people walking past this table with their tongues on the floor.

Mike Edelman, Karen Cooper, Dave Toupal, John Thompson, Dan

Leonard, Ted Kahan and at least a dozen others also had great tables of PEZ.

Look, But Don't Touch

In the center of the room was a display of the most incredible proportions. Let me try to name just a few of the hundreds of museum quality pieces on display. Dan Leonard displayed his One Piece Gold Elephant, 16 different Eerie Specters, an unusual chrome Mickey Mouse, PEZ Shooters in black, blue, red, and green and two Pineapples with different tops! Barry Koester had, among other things, his yellow Popeye, black Psy. Eye, rubberhead Disneys, PEZ Yo-Yo, a cool PEZ bank, and a Make-A-Face. (In all, there were at least 5 Make-A-Faces on display)

There was also some unusual factory mock-ups of three different dispensers. They were made of solid resin and were about two to three times bigger than normal. Also, we saw a Regular autographed by PEZhead/actor Bill Mummy, plus a Wonder Woman autographed by Linda Carter. My custom Star Wars Body Parts were there, as well as the new tin PEZ Eyewear cases. Johann had 3 or 4 Make-A-Faces displayed, two Owl whistles, a clear stemmed Garfield, A PEZ camera, an all blue Smurf, five PEZ "BOX" dispensers, and a Hippo MIB!

In the middle of the display was a huge wedding cake donated by Wilson Bakery. It was covered in PEZ candy and dispensers, with a Bride and Groom on top.

Spend, Spend, Spend!

The crowd was in a frenzy of PEZ buying. Believe me when I say people were 4 & 5 deep trying to squeeze in to dealer tables. Among the PEZ buying and trading, raffles continued throughout the day. The prizes included several assortments, Batman with cape and even a Batgirl dispenser.

Around noon, the wedding cake was cut and passed out to anyone who wanted some. It was totally devoured within minutes. Everyone satisfied their sweet tooth...then it was back to the tables for more wheeling and dealing!

Needless to say, THOUSANDS of dollars changed hands that day. By 3 o'clock, we were pooped and ready for the auction.

Going, Going, Gone...

This years auction, I have to say, was kind of disappointing. Don't get me

wrong. Larry and all the volunteers did an incredible job. The auction had tons of great stuff, and the volunteers instantly computerized and cataloged all auction items. The real disappointment was with the crowd. Maybe everyone was out of money. But there were what seemed like dozens of items



that ended up with NO BID! And I'm talking good pieces. And some of the non-dispenser items that did sell went for embarrassingly low prices. Of the 80 lots, at least 21 didn't even get a bid. 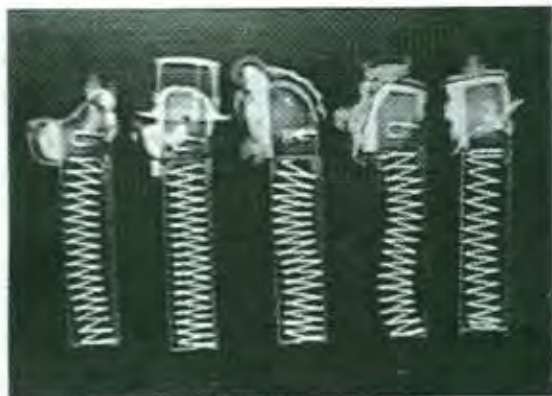
"USS EnterPEZ"

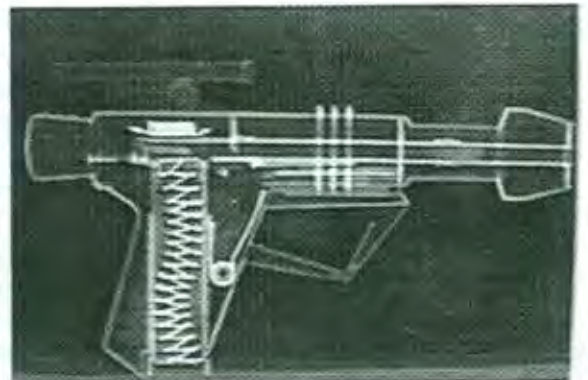
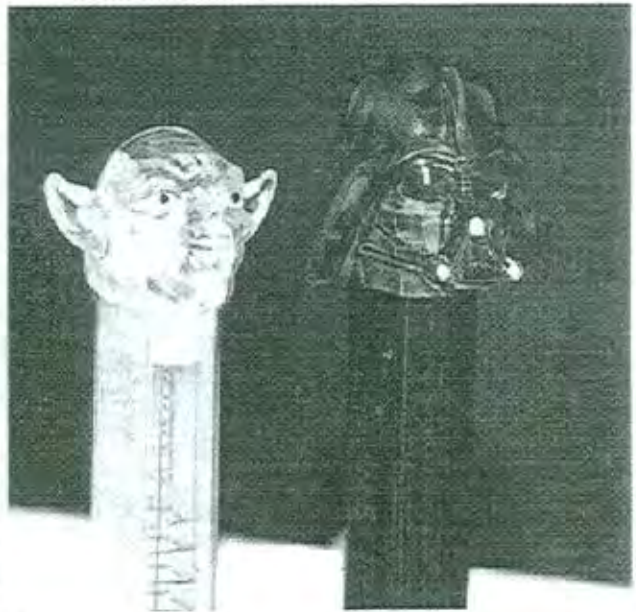
Custom Star Wars Body Parts

All the striped cards in foreign countries have been discontinued. It seems other countries are going with cards that



are almost carbon copies of US "cartoon character" type cards. They will have the PEZ logo on the angled stripe, like the U.S. cards...and pictures of the characters as well. But they won't have the bubble plastic. They will still be vacuum plastic packed as they are now.

PEZ In Print

The recent catalog from **Figi's** (chocolates and gift baskets) had an assortment of treats that included PEZ. Their "Personalized Bunny Tins" contained an assortment of chocolates, a plush bunny, a stamper, and a PEZ dispenser and candy. Pictured with the assortment was a Tweety Bird dispenser!

An article in "**16**" Magazine reveals yet another Hollywood PEZhead! In the story, Larisa Oleynik, who plays Alex Mack on the Nickelodeon show, "The Secret World of Alex Mack", confesses to having the PEZ bug!

In the March 28 **Toy Shop**, magazine, there was a one page article on PEZ collector Shawn Peterson! Pictured were 4 Psychedelic Eyes and 4 Psychedelic Flowers among other things.

Also in the same issue of **Toy Shop**, the Star Wars PEZ were photographed and featured in an article titled "Return of the Trilogy and the Toys". More good press for PEZ.

"Q: My son and I enjoy *The Pretender*. We noticed that Jarod—the lead character, played by Michael T. Weiss—has a PEZ dispenser. How did this idea originate? My son collects vintage PEZ dispensers.

From the Apr. 18 issue of "**Isthmus**", a Madison, Wisconsin newspaper.

The article mentions the scarcity of PEZ in Britain, mentioning only "Woolie's" (Woolworth's) as a source. They also say that the variety of flavors is less in Britain than in the US, which we all know is wrong. The UK has 5 fruit flavors...the 4 we have in the U.S., plus cherry.

The syndicated newspaper column "**The Straight Dope**", by Cecil Adams, during the last week of April, was all about the origin of PEZ. Adams discussed Eduard Haas, the inventor of PEZ, and the origin of the word PEZ.

Rob Yarak's PEZ collection was featured on the UPN show **Strange Universe** March 17. The show featured a segment called "Weird Collectors", and Rob's collection was in the spotlight for about a minute.

Quote from the **Jeff Foxworthy** show in early April (As his oldest son snaps a rubberband against his wrist) "I'm using this rubberband to break my addiction to PEZ!"

Less Than Jake, the alternative band with the PEZCore album, was on the nationally syndicated radio show **Love**

Line March 25th. The band talked extensively about PEZ, and had a lot of callers who thought PEZ was cool. They even mentioned attending the San Jose PEZ convention!

The show "**Malcolm and Eddie**" had a reference to PEZ. Malcolm is the "straight" man and Eddie is the hustler-type character. 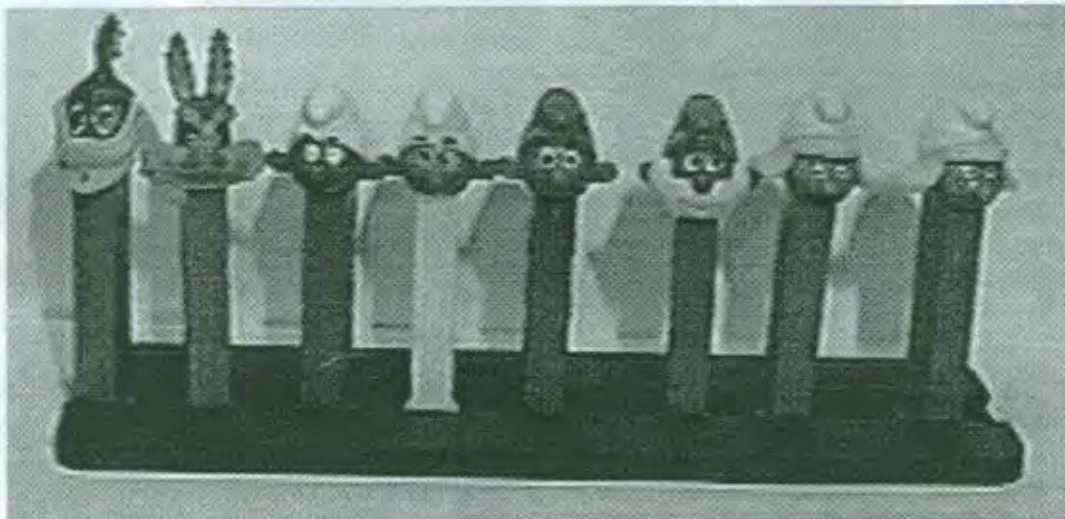

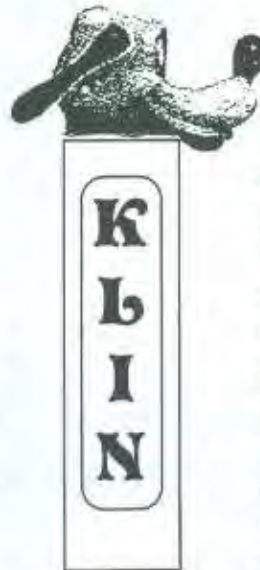

AWESOME RARE PEZ!

I was lucky enough to see a really neat item that was at the convention, a piece very few people had the chance to see. George Taylor was given this dispenser by an old friend. There is no copyright info on the stem, and it has the old metal spring inside the head. George's friend got it at

Advice from the PEZhead email list:

Top ten things to do when making a PEZ trade/purchase via the mail

- 1) Who are you? (Real name, Phone number, Address)
- 2) Do you have any references?
- 3) Exactly what are we trading/buying (Pat #'s, Stem color, head details, and condition...) The goal here is not to be surprised.
- 4) Exactly what am I sending you in return?
- 5) Where am I sending these to? (I always have my items shipped to my office. There is always someone there to accept them)
- 6) Shipping details (US Mail, UPS, Fedex etc...)
- 7) When the trade/purchase was (or will be) shipped
- 8) When the payment is shipped
- 9) What happens if I get the item and disagree with your characterization of it?
- 10) What was that Phone number again?

And when dealing over the internet, PRINT OUT THE DETAILS and SAVE THEM!

Keep the details on hand until AFTER the deal is completed. Give a courtesy message to your trade partner letting them know that you received the items in good shape. Another bit of advice: If you don't want to lose it, don't trade it with someone you don't know about...

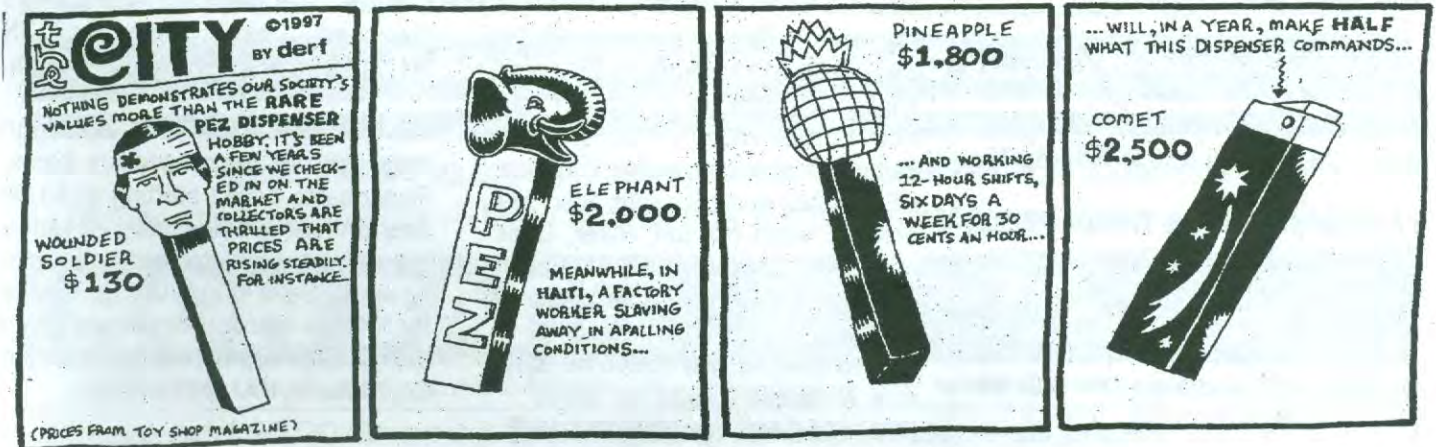

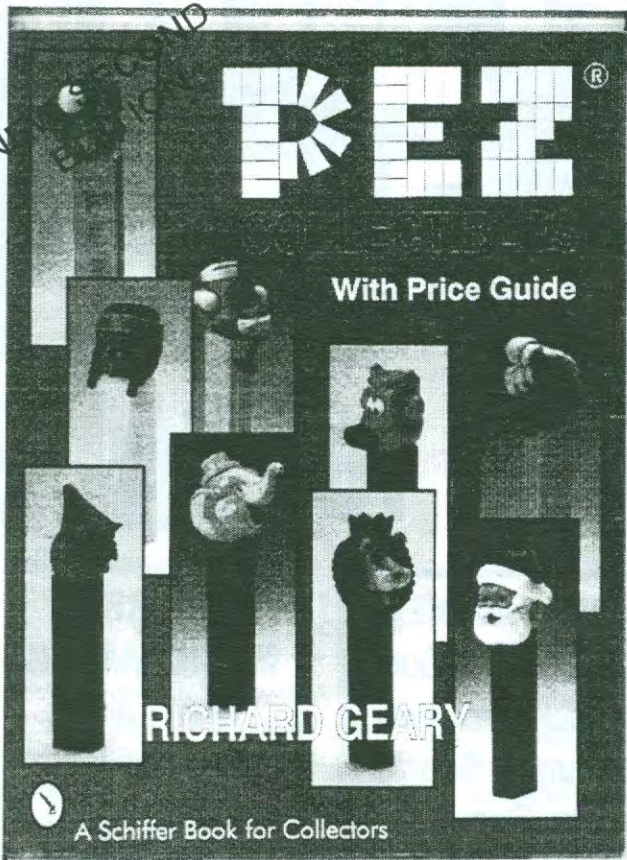
