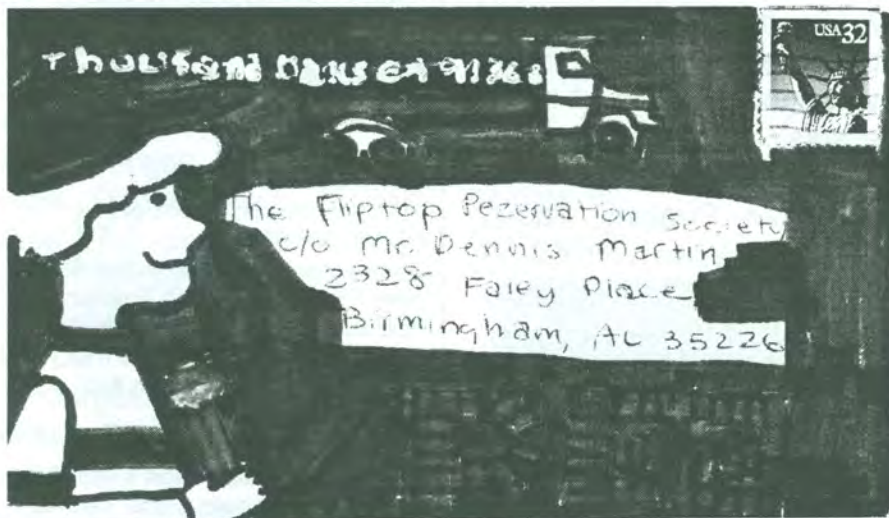

According to organizer John Devlin, over 600 people migrated to Missouri for the 5th Annual National PEZ Convention! All the convention registrants were pumped! Heck, conventioneer Corey Friedman even became a TRUE PEZhead for the weekend. He shaved the word PEZ onto the back of his head!

One surprising fact...almost 30 rooms were open for room hopping THURSDAY night! John says some of the best deals were made a full day before the convention even started!

The majority of conventioners arrived Friday. They were happy to check in and pick up their registration packets and T-shirts. This years T-shirts and hats were blazoned with the St. Louis arch, under which 3-piece Witches were stirring a pot. There were

Some of the items given away in BINGO were: Mickey n/f, Mr. Ugly, Maharajah, Baloo, Policeman, PEZ bumper stickers, T-shirts, sweat-shirts, pins, a CEACO PEZ puzzle, PEZ to go from FAO, Bambi, PEZ frisbee, Frog MMM, Batman w/cape, Angel, Elephant w/hair, Daniel Boone, a Snow White PEZ, and various paper items! The last game was for a yellow, full body Space Trooper! Most people playing BINGO won't soon forget newcomers Bob and Bobbi LaPorte. Oh... I Wish I Was A Plastic PEZ Dispenser...
That Is What I'd Truly Love To Be...

Hasn't it been said that imitation is the sincerest form of flattery? If that's the case, PEZ ought to feel pretty flattered these days! There's no doubt about it. PEZ is hot! And it seems that more than one company is trying to cash in on their success. It's a simple formula really. Take a candy dispensing cartridge, but a funny head on it, and boom...you're in the game.

First there was Totems, TV Pals, and Yummies. But they faded fast. But now there's a whole new wave of PEZ impersonators, and most have caught the fancy of us PEZ collectors!

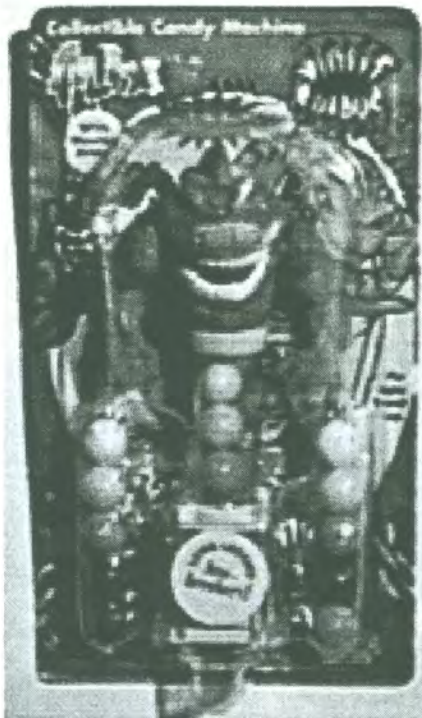
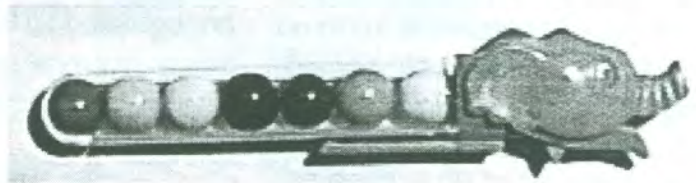
Then came FLIX. We're all familiar with these. Their popularity is growing among PEZ collectors. The only problem with these, is that the different characters seem to be much more short lived than their PEZ counterparts. Many of the characters released only a couple of years ago are already discontinued. That's a shame, because the detail in the heads is incredible. The dispensing mechanism, however, is boring in my opinion.



randomly put on the characters. The stems are hot pink, yellow, bright green and neon orange. You pull the cartridge up, like a PEZ to insert the candy. But unlike PEZ, dispensing the candy requires a double action. You have to pull the "trigger" back and then push it forward to achieve candy ecstasy. So far they have only been found at Family Dollar...and sell for 79 cents each.

There is also a report of some other Smarties candy dispensers from London. These dispensers are reportedly some sort of military figures, with clear, round stems. On the side at the top is a spring loaded trigger which shoots out the candy. I haven't actually seen these yet, so for now they will remain unconfirmed.

A company called HiLCO has released a new set of stem and head candy dispensers. These new dispensers have a clear, round stem that resembles a thick ballpoint pen. Each stem is capped with a cartoony animal head. To dispense the candy, you pull a tab on



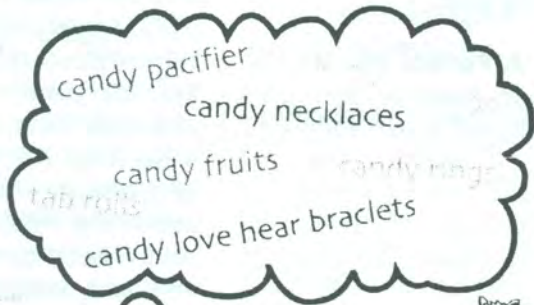
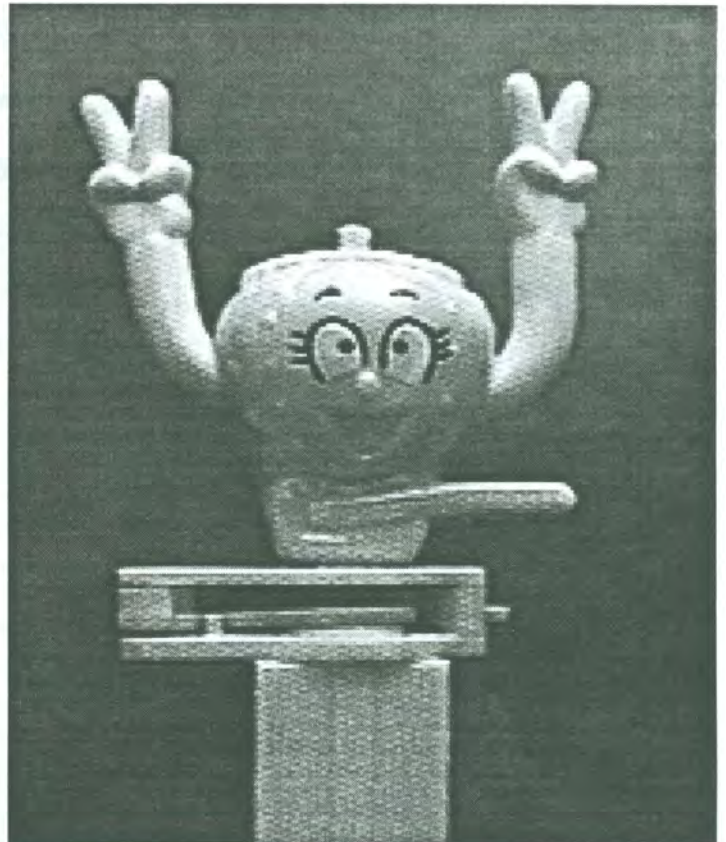
Now for a couple of new products on today's market. FUN-FLIPS, by R.L. Albert & Sons, are new dispensers that resemble a Totem. The "heads" are funny fruit characters with faces and bendable arms. Each dispenser is sold with two packs of Smarties brand candy. There are six fruit characters: Orange, Apple, Banana, Grapes, Strawberry, and Green Pineapple. The bendable yellow or orange arms

have at least 6-8 variations on the hands, and are



the bottom jaw, and the mouth pops open. To the delight of kids everywhere, out of the character's mouth vomits a gumball surprise! There is no spring action involved here. You have to tilt the dispenser forward to roll the gumball out, and then manually push the jaw closed. I have only found 2 heads so far...a pink Elephant and a pink Hippo. But the display was almost empty, so other heads may exist.

Here's yet another candy company trying to cash in on the PEZ craze. But they are forgoing the idea of a new dispenser. Koko's Confectionery, a division of a national vending machine manufacturer, sells "sweet tart" type candy in all kinds of shapes. They have clowns, teddy bears, smily face, and soda bottle shaped candy. Well, on a recent flyer sent out to candy brokers, in addition to their hundreds of other candies, they have a blurb about a new candy. It reads "Coming Soon...Koko's Brand Refills For Your PEZ Dispenser!" I contacted the company, and they say that the candy is sold as bulk loose candies, just like most of their inventory. The company says it is available now, and can be found at "bulk" type candy stores, like the ones in the mall where you buy candy by the pound.

PEZ Media Moments

The "**Over the Hedge**" comic by Micheal Fry and T. Lewis mentioned PEZ recently. The characters were playing in the Masters golf tournament. One character puts a spoon in his mouth, strikes the ball with the spoon and wins the Masters with a hole in one. The response from his partner is: "[next] he'll win the British Open using only his big toe and a Drew Carey PEZ dispenser"

The May 5, 1997 issue of **Newsweek** had an article that mentioned PEZ. The article, "*Thanks, Miss America*" is about the musical **Jekyll & Hyde**. It reads... "Not every musical inspires it's own PEZ dispenser, but then there aren't many shows like Jekyll & Hyde. During it's 34-city pre-Broadway tour, Hyde used to slash the throat of a prostitute named Lucy and snap her head back, gushing fake blood onto her frilly white smock. To the 200-member "Jekyll" Fan Club - a.k.a. Jekkies - it looked like a PEZ dispenser unloading cherry-flavored candy. So one Jekkie glued an auburn haired Barbie head on top of

a PEZ container, draped it in white frills and presented it to Linda Eder, who plays Lucy."

On the season finale of **The Pretender**, PEZ made a small but memorable appearance! Jarod was talking to his "brother" and offered him a PEZ-a-saur. He says "there's candy under the head". Having never seen a PEZ dispenser, his brother took the dispenser, bit off the head, spit it out, and sucked the candy from the stem! Jarod also later leaves a message by spelling out "Refuge" with PEZ candy on a desk. "Refuge" was the safety word that Jarod used as a child when he wanted to end a simulation.

PEZ played a role in the one man performance "**Slightly Bigger Cities**", written and performed by actor Bruce McCulloch. (Of Kids In The Hall and Brain Candy fame.) Halfway through the show, McCulloch sits down on his sofa, pauses silently, then in a firm voice yells "PEZ". After a pause, he repeats himself "PEZ!" The audience watches in silence...and again he says "PEZ" From behind the black

curtain a flunky comes out with a Sylvester dispenser, flicks back the head and dispenses a single candy. McCulloch eats it and the flunky exits.

In "**A Perfect World**" with Kevin Costner and Clint Eastwood, a package of PEZ candy appears briefly. I haven't seen the film yet, but the package is reportedly the same "striped" multi flavor variety that is sold today. However, the movie was supposed to take place in the 1960's...long before that style packaging was ever printed!

Jerry Sienfeld was talking to **Jay Leno** in May...and mentioned PEZ. Leno asked him about some of the products that played a theme on the show. And of course, he said PEZ!

PEZ-A-mania organizer **Jill Cohen** was interviewed back in May by WGN personalities Steve and Johnnie. They were doing a series of interviews with collectors. Jill said it was a very good interview. They asked thoughtful interesting questions and did not resort

to the type of cheap shots that demean the hobby or the guests.

And speaking of radio, **Richard Geary** (author of "PEZ Collectibles") interviewed **Scott McWinnie** on the radio June 17. Richard, who does the morning drive show on 97 WFUN in Cleveland, talked to the "Pezident" about the PEZ collecting hobby. Scott confirmed that they have some good things in the works for us collectors, but wouldn't elaborate any further!

On Memorial Day, **The Jenny Jones** show had a giant PEZ. The show was about people who had secret crushes. One guest had a crush on a man who collects PEZ. So she surprised the man by dressing up as a Bugs Bunny dispenser!

The National Enquirer will have an article about Maryann Kennedy's PEZ collection in July! The tentative date for the article is July 15. But any huge scandal or alien landing could bump the article until later. So now you have a rea-

son to pick up the tabloid in the supermarket checkout!

I beat, tortured and called my contact bad names. But I could get no more information about Project Q at this time. They say when everything is finalized, we'll be the first to know!

Displaying Their PEZ

PEZ Candy Inc. made a big showing the first week in June at the **All Candy Expo** trade show in Chicago. They had a display area full of current dispensers in a variety of displays (floor & counter) Scott McWinnie was there as well as other PEZ sales reps. They say that the new Garfields are definitely coming to the US. Look for them in mid-1998. Darth Vader was also working their booth and showing off the Star Wars dispensers.

All Over The Galaxy?

PEZ **Star Wars** dispensers are turning up everywhere now. One of the wierdest places they have been found is in the Smithsonian Museum in D.C...in the aeronautics souvenir shop! OK, sure...they may be in the Smithsonian, but retailer are having a hard time ordering

Star Wars dispensers these days. Here's the scoop. PEZ Inc is not technically "sold out" of Star Wars dispensers. The fact is, the current orders that they have exceed the expected number of dispensers they will produce through the end of the year. So, current orders from retailers are being filled, and new orders may take a few months to fill. But, PEZ assures me that they are making Star Wars PEZ every day, and they will NOT run out.

Going, Going...Gone?

And speaking of shortages, if you ordered the Bubbleman assortment from PEZ lately, you may have received a surprise. The factory temporarily ran out of the PEZ Pal Girl dispenser. Instead of holding all the incoming orders, they decided to substitute the Panda in place of the Girl. Why the Panda? Their research showed that the Panda dispenser wasn't as readily available across the country as the other "favorites" dispensers. Accompanying the Panda was a note explaining the switch. Customers have the option of returning the Panda with the note and getting the Girl at a later date. But so far, that has almost never happened!

New Cards!

There is a new PEZ candy refill card on the shelves in Canada! They are yellow with very colorful little PEZ candies splattered all over.

FLIX Update

Hercules and Megora FLIX are starting to appear now. Hercules comes on a blue and aqua base and Megora comes on a aqua and plum base. Both contain Willy Wonka Gobstoppers with chewy centers! They also have patent

pending and a sticker on the bottom rather than the imprinted 5.3 patent. And at Disney World, I found mostly Pooh Bear FLIX, some Minnie Mouse FLIX, and a small amount of Mickey FLIX.

PEZ In The Kingdom

Now, more from the Magic Kingdom. On a recent trip, I found PEZ at all the Disney parks. (Disney characters only...of course) There was a fairly even mix of old & new Mickeys, a few new Plutos, and I saw one new Goofy PEZ. They could be found in the candy stores, and the candy sections of larger gift shops. We even had PEZ for sale at our Disney hotel. At the Star Tours gift shop at MGM, I saw 2 counter display boxes of Star Wars dispensers early in the morning. 2 hours later...there was only one box left with one Yoda dispenser! Later, the boxes, and all the PEZ, were gone!

Oh, one more thing. At the German pavilion in Epcot, a family from Pennsylvania saw my PEZ T-shirt, and screamed "PEZ!" They told me that they had been collecting for about a year!

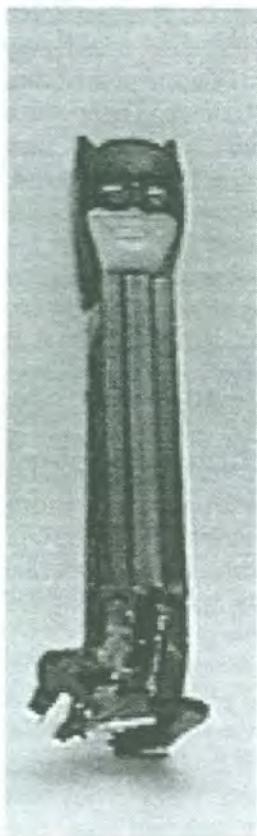

The horror of a mutated, unloved PEZ dispenser was staring me in the face. During a stop at a local garage sale, I

opened a case that was used to store pistol ammunition and gun cleaning supplies. In the case, among the shooting stuff, I found what was left of a PEZ dispenser... murdered by what looked like a .22 caliber round! Who could have done such a thing! Seeing that PEZ brought back a memory of a Green Hornet dispenser I had seen in San Jose. It was melted almost beyond recognition. From this point on, I knew that there was a dark side to PEZ collecting. A side that I was almost afraid to

I once met a toy dealer at an outdoor flea market in Atlanta that should have faced neglect charges. He had an entire glass case full of Captain America and dark green Hulk dispensers! The only problem...he had left them out in the sun too long. The temperature in the case rose so high, all the dispensers curled up like little plastic letter C's.

Then there's my "not so jolly" St. Nick...crushed almost into oblivion. I look

at him and envision hundreds of Make-A-Face dispensers being crushed and melted down. Is there no justice?

I have contacted many collectors who own, or have seen at least one poor destroyed PEZ. Here are a few other stories of PEZheads worst PEZ nightmares...

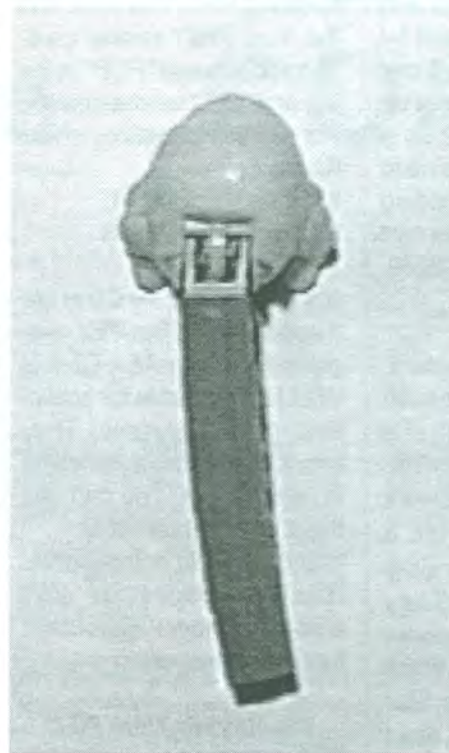

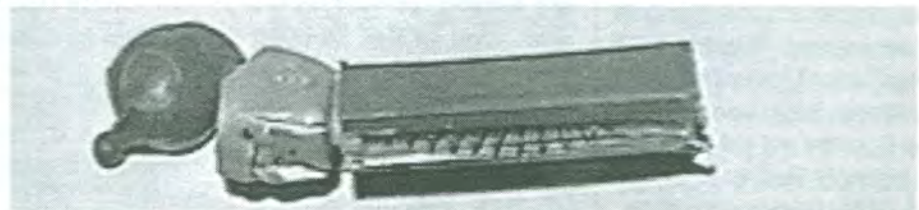

Another one of my mutants is an older Donald that I picked up at a flea market. It had apparently been stored in some dank drawer forever...with the candy still inside! And last I have a Rudolph that has been "Van Goh'ed". (missing it's ears) The stems a bit crunched as well.

CANADIAN NEWS

The new **Disney** dispensers are shipping into Canada now. They are on powder blue cards with figures of Minnie, Donald, Pluto and Goofy. One interesting note, many of the Disney cases in Canada are mixed with new and old variations of dispensers! All, however, are on the new cards. Although the **Duck Nephews** have shown up on the latest Canadian ad sheets, the green hats are more scarce. The blue hats stopped shipping for about a year, but are shipping now on the new cards. Any of these are fairly hard finds in Canada and you will seldom if ever find all 3 on the same rack just because of the shipping peculiarities of the Disney cases.

The **Flintstones** are also available in Canada. Their Canadian card has the same graphics as the US card...just a bit smaller. **Batman** with pointy ears is out on the new orange card with the "animated" Batman graphics and "The Adventures of Batman & Robin" logo. A few of the old small

headed **BLUE** Batman have shown up in Canada on this new card. Also, an even smaller amount of the old black Batman on **blue** stems have surfaced, also on the new card. Incidentally, the insert from the YPS magazine (see page 20) shows this blue/black Batman wearing a Body Part. None of these blue and blue/black Batman dispensers on the orange card have a country of origin on the stem, but all the cards are Hungarian.

New Tom & Jerry, Tuffy, Droopy & Spike (all new molds with mostly fluorescent stems) are shipping on the new MGM cards. (Aqua-green background with a large gray Tom and a small brown Jerry.) Because the MGM line has so many new variations, you can find the new card with several variations of the same dispenser ie: new card with old Tom or new Tom etc...like the Disney.

MGM 2-Packs

Last fall, PEZ brought out the two pack MGM on the 2-pack cards. (that is to say one dispenser and one body part side by side on an extra wide card. In that set

there was Tom (he was a new mold Tom Jerry, Tuffy, Droopy (a newer Droopy on a lime green stem...longer nose), and Spike. That was a limited edition and no longer ships and was in very short production to begin with. So NOW they are re-shipping...sort of. The first Tom was available on the 2-packs with a purple stem and with either a Cavalry Officer body part or a Convict body part. Now he has a fluorescent red stem.....with either body part.

Originally, the Jerry 2-pack was the OLD painted face Jerry without eyelashes. It now has a fluorescent yellow stemmed new Jerry with eyelashes , on the card with a Space Robot body part.

The new Tuffy 2-pack is just a remold of the brown faced Jerry but has a gray face and eyelashes as well and is on a powder blue stem with a Cavalry Officer body part. Spike ships only 3 to a case and the rarest of them all. He has no changes from the last 2 pack.

Droopy no longer has a lime green stem. He is strictly sold on Red stems in this issue, plus he has a longer nose.

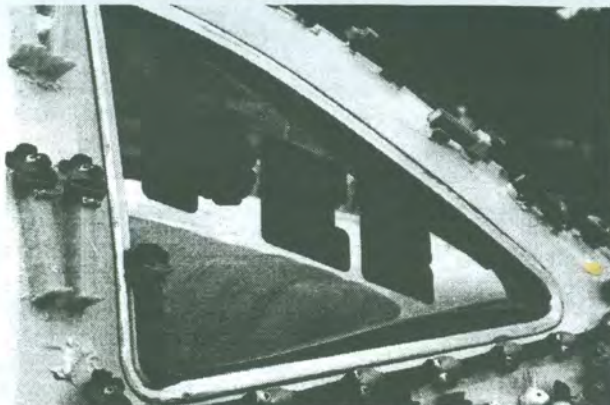

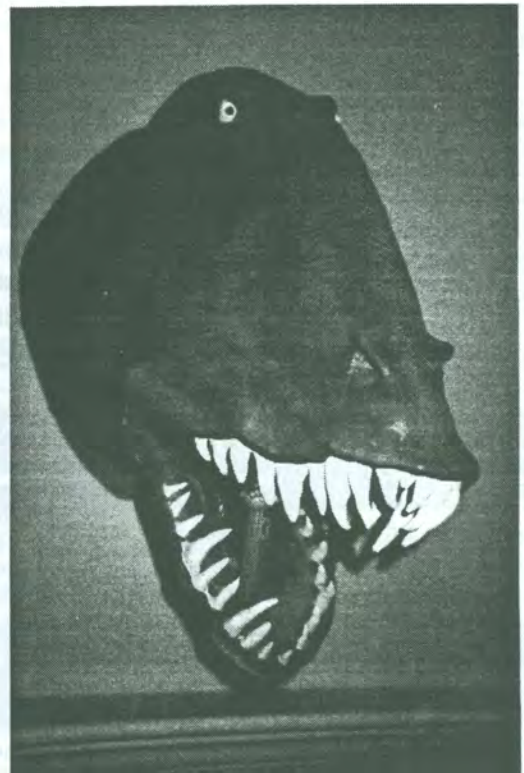

YPS in bag with PEZ & Body Part giveaway

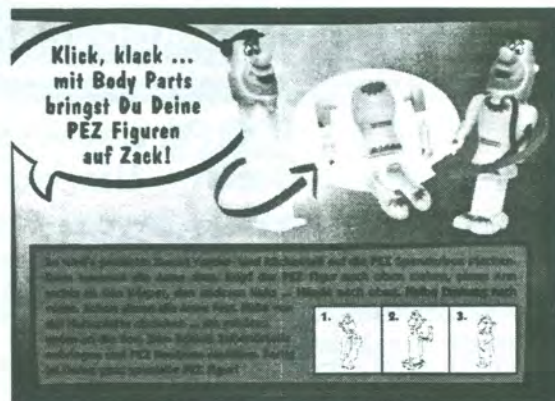
YPS magazine is a German comic that has been around for years. Each issue comes with some sort of giveaway, or "Gimmick". In fact, PIF the Dog is a character in YPS, and the PIF dispenser was an original giveaway from YPS back in the 1980's. Now, issue # 1058 has made a return to the YPS "PEZ" gimmicks. The issue came with two prizes...a seed packet to grow an Easter egg tree, and a PEZ + Body Part! The dispenser and all the Body Part pieces came loose in a small cellophane bag. Also inside the bag was a neat German insert, that shows how to assemble the Body Part. On the back of the insert is a photo of all the Body Parts.
